IN RE: SB1043 by Watson (Relating to the criminal penalty for the discarding of certain burning materials.), As Introduced

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would create an offense for discarding lighted litter. The provisions of the bill are not expected to result in significant additional workload for any state agencies.
