No. 326 By: Guillen A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT relating to the reporting requirements of, and certain unfunded 2 mandates related to the functions of, a state agency that is 3 undergoing review by the Sunset Advisory Commission. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 325, Government Code, is amended by 7 adding Section 325.0075 to read as follows: 8 Sec. 325.0075. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS OF AGENCY BEING REVIEWED. Before September 1 of the odd-numbered year before the 9 10 year in which a state agency subject to this chapter is abolished, the agency shall submit to the commission, the governor, the 11 lieutenant governor, and each member of the legislature a report 12 13 that: (1) lists each report that the agency is required by a 14 15 statute to prepare; and 16 (2) evaluates the need for each report listed in 17 Subdivision (1) based on whether factors or conditions have changed 18 since the date the statutory requirement to prepare the report was 19 enacted. 20 SECTION 2. - 14 (b) During <u>a review of a state agency</u>, a political
- 15 <u>subdivision</u> affected by a mandate related to the functions of the
- 16 agency may present information to the commission regarding the
- 17 mandate and costs associated with the mandate and may recommend
- 18 changes to current law that may provide more efficient use of
- 19 resources.
- 20 <u>(c)</u> A political subdivision may periodically review each
- 21 <u>mandate to which the political subdivision is subject and recommend</u>
- 22 changes for making an activity or measure more efficient, including
- 23 <u>elimination</u> of [the regular session immediately following the

- 25 may continue the mandate for a period not to exceed three years, by
- 26 law may repeal the mandate, or may take no action on] the mandate,
