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1	Sec. 1119.052. EMPLOYMENT OF PHYSICIANS. (a) The board may
2	employ a physician and retain all or part of the professional income
3	generated by the physician for medical services provided at a
4	hospital or other health care facility owned or operated by the
5	district if the board satisfies the requirements of this section.
6	(b) The board shall:
7	(1) appoint a chief medical officer for the district;
8	and
9	(2) adopt, maintain, and enforce policies to ensure
10	that a physician employed by the district exercises the physician's
11	independent medical judgment in providing care to patients.
12	(c) The policies adopted under this section must include:
13	(1) policies relating to:
14	(A) credentialing;
15	(B) quality assurance;
16	(C) utilization review;
17	(D) peer review; and
18	(E) medical decision-making; and
19	(2) the implementation of a complaint mechanism to
20	process and resolve complaints regarding interference or attempted
21	interference with a physician's independent medical judgment.
22	(d) The policies adopted under this section:
23	(1) must be approved by the chief medical officer of
24	the district; and
25	(2) shall prevail over a conflicting policy of the
26	district.
27	(e) For all matters relating to the practice of medicine,

          (f) The chief medical officer will report immediately to the

    Texas Medical Board any action or event that the chief medical

6	Sec. 1119.151. ADDITIONAL MEANS OF SECURING REPAYMENT OF
7	BONDS. In addition to the authority to issue general obligation

9	Safety Code, the board may provide for the security and repayment of
10	district bonds from a pledge of a combination of taxes as authorized
11	by Section 286.142, Health and Safety Code, and revenue and other
12	sources as authorized by Section 286.144, Health and Safety Code.
