4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 92.0131, Property Code, is amended by
6 adding Subsection (c-2) to read as follows:

7 (c-2) Notwithstanding Subsection (c-1), a municipal housing
8 authority located in a municipality that has a population of more
9 than 500,000 and is not more than 50 miles from an international
10 border, or a public facility corporation, affiliate, or subsidiary
11 of the authority, may require that vehicles parked in a community of
12 the authority, corporation, affiliate, or subsidiary:

13 (1) be registered with the housing authority;

14 (2) display proof of current vehicle registration in
15 this state and a current state inspection certificate; and

16 (3) be covered by liability insurance in an amount
17 sufficient to constitute proof of financial responsibility
18 required by Chapter 601, Transportation Code.

19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
