1 WHEREAS, Marcela Paola Borja Roman of Ecuador and other 2 professionals from Latin America were invited to participate in a 3 U.S. Department of State International Visitor Leadership Program 4 in May 2013, and Dallas was among the cities included on their tour; 5 and

6 WHEREAS, Established in 1940, IVLP connects current and 7 emerging foreign leaders with their American counterparts through 8 short-term exchanges; an initiative of the Bureau of Educational 9 and Cultural Affairs, the program centers around a project theme 10 and typically includes visits to four U.S. communities; and

11 WHEREAS, With a focus on the administration of justice, this 12 IVLP event was designed to help leaders from other countries deepen 13 their understanding of the civil, criminal, juvenile, and military 14 justice systems in the United States; participants examined the 15 underlying principles of the U.S. judicial and legal systems and 16 studied the administration of courts, case management, the trial by 17 jury process, and alternative dispute resolution; and

18 WHEREAS, Mrs. Borja Roman brought a valuable perspective to 19 the experience; she has a doctor of law degree from the Central 20 University of Ecuador and holds the position of Public Defender for 21 Children and Teenagers, Ministry of Justice; and
