6 years, he served his nation as an air defense artillery officer in
7 the U.S. Army, and he retired at Fort Bliss in 1970 at the rank of
8 lieutenant colonel; four decades later, his son, Major General Dana
9 J. H. Pittard, would serve as post commander of the El Paso base;

12 Lieutenant Colonel Pittard went on to own several businesses in El
13 Paso; in 1980, he moved to San Antonio, where he was a valued member
14 of Greater Love Missionary Baptist Church; in his leisure time,
