5 WHEREAS, Born in Fort Worth on December 24, 1950, to Roy and 6 Myrtle Manley Williams, Mr. Williams graduated from R. L. Paschal 7 High School in 1971 and earned a bachelor's degree in political 8 science and sociology from Texas A&M University--Commerce; 9 following graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Army and served until 10 he was honorably discharged in 1979; he subsequently joined the 11 U.S. Air Force Reserve and served until 1983; and

12 WHEREAS, A certified teacher, Mr. Williams was employed by the Fort Worth Independent School District from 1979 until his 13 death; he also worked as a legislative aide to former State 14 Representative Garfield Thompson; active in politics at the local 15 16 and state levels, he served as president of the Fort Worth Chapter of the Texas Coalition of Black Democrats, as a Tarrant County 17 Steering Committee member for Barack Obama's presidential 18 campaign, as a precinct chair and as financial secretary to the 19 20 Tarrant County Precinct Workers Council, and as a delegate to the 21 Texas State Democratic Party Convention; and

22 WHEREAS, Mr. Williams was a charter member of his 23 undergraduate chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity; he was also a 24 life member of the fraternity, a member of multiple alumni
