WHEREAS, Appointed speaker pro tempore for the 81st Texas 2 3 Legislature, Representative Eiland also won praise for efficient management of the local and consent calendar that 4 5 session, which sped along at a handy clip that was often enhanced by the thunderous accompaniment of one of his children on the gavel; 6 widely admired for his ability to keep the legislative process on 7 8 track during debate on a highly contentious issue, he is also noted for his expertise in insurance matters and budget issues, and he has 9 served four terms as vice chair of the House Insurance Committee and 10 six terms as a valued member of the House Appropriations Committee; 11 he has further served as chair of the Pensions and Investments 12 Committee and as vice chair of the Juvenile Justice and Family 13 14 Issues Committee, the Election Contests Select Committees in 2003 15 and 2005, and the Election Contest District 48 Select Committee in 2011, among many other committee assignments; and 16 17 WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan has twice been ranked as one of the "Ten Best Legislators" by Texas Monthly magazine, and he has 18 19 been named Citizen of the Year by the Galveston County Daily News; the recipient of numerous accolades, he has been selected as 20 Legislator of the Year by such organizations as the Texas Hospital 21 Association, the Texas Council of Child Welfare Boards, and the 22 United Ways of Texas, and he has been accorded the President's Award 23 24 by the Texas Public Health Association; the Bay Area Houston Economic Partnership gave him its 2010 Quasar Award in recognition 25 26 of his contributions to the region's recovery from one of the nation's worst natural disasters; and 27

1 WHEREAS, Born in 1962, Representative Eiland grew up in West Texas and lettered in football at Baylor University, where he 2 3 completed his bachelor's degree in business administration; he went on to graduate from Baylor Law School and briefly worked on a cattle 4 5 ranch in the Australian outback before settling in Galveston and joining the state's oldest law firm, Mills, Shirley, Eckel & 6 Bassett; he was subsequently employed by nationally known Houston 7 8 attorney Ernest H. Cannon; he opened his own practice in 1992, and today his firm has offices in Galveston and Houston and represents 9 10 clients in complex litigation in cities across the nation and in a number of foreign countries; the Baylor Law School chose him as 11 12 Young Lawyer of the Year in 1999, and he has been awarded membership in the American Board of Trial Advocates and the American 13 14 Association for Justice; and

WHEREAS, Craig Eiland and his wife, Melissa, are the proud parents of four children, Blake, Tucker, Gray, and Delaney, who have all exhibited precocious aplomb in wielding the parliamentary gavel; and
