WHEREAS, July 31, 2013, marks the 60th wedding anniversary of

2 Saoroth and Yani Keo of Houston, and this joyous event provides a fitting opportunity to reflect on their remarkable journey together 3 as husband and wife; and 4 WHEREAS, Natives of Cambodia, Saoroth Keo and the former Yani 5 Rose Yos were brought together by their families; their fathers, 6 7 both judges, had agreed to a union between their children before Mrs. Keo was even born, and Mr. Keo eventually chose the bold and 8 strong-willed Yani over her more serene older sister; they were 9 joined in matrimony in Phnom Penh in 1953, when Mrs. Keo was just 10 11 15, but contrary to tradition, she continued her education even 12 after the birth of their first child; and 13 WHEREAS, Having studied engineering in Paris, Mr. Keo became 14 director of Cambodia's railroads; Mrs. Keo honed her linguistic skills through extensive travel abroad and became an interpreter 15 16 for the wife of the president, but political turmoil began to overwhelm the country; when refugees streamed into Phnom Penh, Mrs. 17 Keo helped organize a volunteer aid group; her humanitarian efforts 18 and international connections made her a target of Khmer Rouge 19 20 rebels, and in April 1975, the couple was forced to flee; still 21 hoping to serve his country, Mr. Keo subsequently tried to return, but the situation had grown even more desperate; for five terrible 22 23 months, the whirlwind of political events kept the couple apart,

and Mr. Keo was believed to have been killed until Mrs. Keo learned

- 1 with relief that he had been sent to Houston under the sponsorship
- 2 of Catholic Charities; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Keos began a new life together in Texas, where
- 4 Mr. Keo learned English while working as a clerk at AE Services; his
- 5 employers discovered he was a skilled draftsman and engineer, and
- 6 he ultimately retired as a partner in the company; Mrs. Keo
- 7 continued her philanthropy as a cofounder of the Refugee Services
- 8 Alliance, which expanded its mission to provide aid to all
- 9 immigrants; today, it is known as the Alliance for Multicultural
- 10 Community Services; Mrs. Keo also helped establish the Texas
- 11 Cambodian Temple of Houston and served as president of the
- 12 Cambodian Farm Project and Khmer Village; moreover, she has served
- 13 on the City of Houston Advisory Council of International
- 14 Communities and chaired the Information Group for Asian American
- 15 Rights; the Keos have personally sponsored many Cambodian refugees
- 16 through the years; and
- WHEREAS, Devoted to their family, Mr. and Mrs. Keo take great
- 18 pride in their four children, Rothmoni, Soudeth, Nanda, and Sorith
- 19 Keo, as well as their 10 cherished grandchildren, Michael, Toni,
- 20 Patrick, Mitchell, and Matthew Keo, Christopher and Tiffani Kou,
- 21 Jason and Nancy Chamroeun, and Anand Pok; and
- WHEREAS, The 60 years of marriage that Mr. and Mrs. Keo have
- 23 shared is eloquent affirmation of the meaning of love and
- 24 commitment, and their enduring union is an inspiration to all who
- 25 know them; now, therefore, be it
