WHEREAS, After she was widowed, Mrs. Guinn was determined to 17 18 secure a future for her daughters and purchased a small grocery store that she named Twins' Drive-In, becoming an entrepreneur at a 19 time when few women were; after years of success running that 20 21 business, she was later employed at Knieff's, during which time she developed many lasting friendships; her resourcefulness and will to 22 achieve while working as a single mother made it possible for her 23 24 daughters to further their education; and
