WHEREAS, Jack Winton has been named one of the inaugural recipients of the Pioneer Award by the El Paso Association of Builders; and

WHEREAS, Founded in 1946, the EPAB is affiliated with the National Association of Home Builders and the Texas Association of Builders; it established the Pioneer Award to recognize leaders in building or developing homes and those who have made important contributions to the local industry; and
