## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The current Texas Constitution is this state's fifth
- 2 charter document since statehood, having been formed on the basis
- 3 of previous documents dating back to the days when Texas was an
- 4 independent republic; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The proud independence of Texas has carried forth
- 6 inimitably through each of its constitutions, granting the
- 7 government limited powers and giving broad control to voters,
- 8 thereby embodying the principle of "consent of the governed"; and
- 9 WHEREAS, First enacted in 1876, the Texas Constitution was
- 10 organized into 289 sections contained within 17 articles outlining
- 11 the scope, role, and limitations of governance in this state;
- 12 through proposed changes sent to Texas voters by the legislature,
- 13 sections within those same 17 articles have been added and deleted,
- 14 bringing our current document to 385 sections; and
- WHEREAS, The Texas Constitution of 1876 has expanded through
- 16 the ratification of proposed amendments, with 474 amendments being
- 17 approved, while 179 have been defeated; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Today the Texas Constitution is the nation's
- 19 second-longest such document; sections have been placed in the
- 20 constitution with apparent disregard for the appropriate article
- 21 with which they belong; outdated bonding authority and other
- 22 archaic references remain bound in the document, despite previous
- 23 attempts to address nonsubstantive revisions to the Texas
- 24 Constitution, the most recent of which occurred in 1999; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Texas Constitution of 1876 remains the supreme
- 2 law of the State of Texas, and a strong, independent statement
- 3 asserting the right of Texans to shape their government to their
- 4 view and their capacity to support it; now, therefore, be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the 83rd Legislature of the State of Texas,
- 6 2nd Called Session, hereby request the lieutenant governor and the
- 7 speaker of the house of representatives to create a joint interim
- 8 committee to study a nonsubstantive reorganization of the Texas
- 9 Constitution; and, be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the committee submit a full report, including
- 11 findings and recommendations, to the 84th Texas Legislature in
- 12 January 2015.
