RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Dr. Jack Dennis McCullough, Jr., of Nacogdoches, an
esteemed educator and community leader, passed away on June 16,
2013, at the age of 81; and

WHEREAS, A sixth-generation Texan, Jack McCullough was born 4 5 in San Antonio on August 8, 1931, to Colonel Jack D. McCullough and Helen Williams McCullough; he graduated from Stephenville High 6 School, Tarleton Junior College, and The University of Texas at 7 Austin; earning National Science Foundation Scholarships, he went 8 on to receive a master's degree from Stephen F. Austin State 9 University and a doctoral degree in biology and oceanography from 10 11 Texas A&M University; and

12 WHEREAS, Dr. McCullough was commissioned as a 2nd lieutenant 13 in the U.S. Army, and he served his country with distinction for 14 seven years, achieving the rank of captain before his honorable 15 discharge; early in his notable career in education, he worked as a 16 biology teacher with the Houston Independent School District and 17 with Texas A&M University; in 1964, he settled in Nacogdoches, 18 where he joined the biology department at his alma mater, SFA; and

WHEREAS, During his outstanding 36-year tenure, Dr. McCullough served as director of the environmental science graduate studies program and published more than 50 scientific papers, many of which were presented at state, national, and international scientific conferences; he was awarded a number of honors for his work, including the Regents Professor Award for Research, the

Distinguished Professor Award from the Alumni Association, and the
SFASU Foundation Faculty Achievement Award; outside of the
classroom, he served his field as president of the Texas Academy of
Science and as editor for the Texas Journal of Science; and

5 WHEREAS, Dr. McCullough was an active member of the 6 Nacogdoches community; in addition to his contributions to a number 7 of local committees, he led historical walking tours through the 8 town and narrated bus tours; he shared his time with the Boy Scouts 9 of America, serving on the Eagle Scout board of review, and was a 10 longtime member of Westminster Presbyterian Church, where he served 11 his congregation as an elder; and

12 WHEREAS, Also a valued leader of Rotary International, Dr. 13 McCullough served the club as president, assistant district 14 governor, and district governor; in his work with the group, he 15 traveled across the country to attend conferences and participated 16 in mission trips to Central America in an effort to help to improve 17 the health and living conditions of villagers; and

18 WHEREAS, Dr. McCullough, above all else, was devoted to his 19 family; he was married for 60 years to the former ElaRuth Bankston, 20 with whom he had two sons, Thomas and Bruce; through the years, the 21 couple were further blessed with three grandchildren, Fred, 22 Lindsay, and Miles; and

WHEREAS, Though it is impossible to gauge the full effect of a man's life, some individuals leave their unmistakable mark on the world as they move through it, and Jack McCullough's contributions to his community will long resonate in the lives of all who knew him; now, therefore, be it
