WHEREAS, He met his wife, Genevieve Able, at the university, and they spent 68 years together in a fulfilling marriage and raised three sons, Bill, Kirk, and Greg; they were blessed with 11 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Floppy served as an officer in the United States Navy and was captain of a small boat in the Battle of Saipan; after working for a furniture company, he went on to join his good friend, Scott Mooring, in a business partnership; they perfected a steam carpet cleaning machine and founded a highly successful carpet and upholstery cleaning company, Blackmon Mooring; and

WHEREAS, He and his wife were devoted Texas Christian University alumni and were chosen as recipients of the Most Valuable Alumni Award in 1994; they proudly watched 13 members of their family follow in their footsteps as Texas Christian University students; Floppy and Genevieve were also longtime active members of University Christian Church; and
