RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The State of Texas lost an admired philanthropist

2 and energy industry giant with the passing of George Phydias

3 Mitchell of Galveston on July 26, 2013, at the age of 94; and

WHEREAS, The son of Greek immigrants, Mr. Mitchell was born

in Galveston in 1919; he worked his way through Texas A&M

6 University, selling candy and stationery and running a tailoring

7 and laundry business; after graduating first in his class with a

8 degree in petroleum engineering and geology, he served his country

9 in the Army Corps of Engineers during World War II, attaining the

10 rank of captain; and

11 WHEREAS, This dynamic Texan joined a newly formed wildcatting

company in 1949 as a consulting geologist and engineer; he became a

partner in the firm and was then named president in 1959; under his

14 skillful leadership as chair and chief executive officer, Mitchell

15 Energy & Development Corporation evolved into one of the nation's

16 largest independent oil and gas producers; the company was listed

17 on the New York Stock Exchange before its merger in 2002 with Devon

18 Energy Corporation; and

19 WHEREAS, Recognized as the father of hydraulic fracturing,

20 Mr. Mitchell pioneered drilling and completion technologies that

21 transformed the energy industry; for nearly two decades, he

22 overcame setbacks and ignored naysayers while perfecting methods of

23 extracting natural gas from the Barnett Shale formation in

24 commercial quantities; his foresight and dogged determination

- 1 engendered an industry revolution that has vastly increased global
- 2 supply and enhanced the energy security of North America; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Mitchell also enjoyed tremendous success as a
- 4 real estate developer of rare ambition and imagination; in 1974, he
- 5 established The Woodlands, a 28,000-acre master-planned community
- 6 designed to preserve East Texas forest and other natural resources
- 7 while integrating mixed-income residential development with an
- 8 employment center; the city today is home to about 100,000 people
- 9 and a number of corporations, and it is recognized for the beauty of
- 10 its protected green space, which represents a quarter of its total
- 11 area; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The devoted father of 10, Mr. Mitchell joined with
- 13 his wife, Cynthia Woods Mitchell, to help make the world a better
- 14 place for future generations; in 1978, the couple created the
- 15 Cynthia and George Mitchell Foundation to support innovative,
- 16 sustainable solutions for human and environmental problems; since
- 17 its inception, the foundation has distributed or pledged more than
- 18 \$400 million to a variety of worthy causes, including the promotion
- 19 of sustainability science and clean energy, Cook's Branch
- 20 Conservancy, and the Mitchell Institute for Fundamental Physics and
- 21 Astronomy at Texas A&M; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Mitchell became the most generous benefactor in
- 23 the history of his alma mater, with donations that included the land
- 24 for the university's campus in Galveston; in addition, he spent
- 25 tens of millions rebuilding his hometown, funding the restoration
- 26 of the historic Strand District and resurrecting a long-dormant
- 27 Mardi Gras tradition that now brings 500,000 visitors to the city

- 1 annually; and
- WHEREAS, In his later years, Mr. Mitchell focused
- 3 increasingly on charitable endeavors; he made the Giving Pledge, a
- 4 commitment promoted by Warren Buffett and Bill and Melinda Gates,
- 5 making public the intent he and his late wife had formed to donate
- 6 the majority of their wealth to philanthropic initiatives;
- 7 moreover, he advocated powerfully for tighter regulation of and
- 8 safer practices in the conduct of hydraulic fracturing; and
- 9 WHEREAS, George Mitchell left an indelible imprint on the
- 10 nation as a true visionary of the energy industry, and through his
- 11 exceptional dedication to environmental protection, social equity,
- 12 and economic prosperity, he made important contributions that will
- 13 long continue to resonate in the Lone Star State and beyond; now,
- 14 therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas
- 16 Legislature, 3rd Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the
- 17 remarkable life of George P. Mitchell and extend sincere
- 18 condolences to his loved ones; and, be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 20 prepared for his family and that when the Texas House of
- 21 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of George
- 22 Phydias Mitchell.
