- 1 Amend C.S.H.B. No. 4 (house committee printing) by adding the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS and renumbering the subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly: 3 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Subchapter A, Chapter 6, Water Code, is 4 amended by adding Section 6.0015 to read as follows: Sec. 6.0015. REFERENCES TO EXECUTIVE ADMINISTRATOR. A 6 reference in this code or other law to the executive administrator 8 means the board. 9 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Section 6.011, Water Code, is amended to read 10 as follows: Sec. 6.011. DECLARATION OF POLICY [BOARD AS AGENCY OF 11 STATE]. The board, as provided by the constitution, this code, and 12 the other laws of this state, is the state agency primarily 13 14 responsible for: 15 (1) planning for the conservation, management, and development of the water resources in this state; and 16 17 (2) the administration of financial assistance through programs for the conservation, management, and development 18 of the water resources in this state, including financial 19 assistance for wastewater treatment and flood control projects 20 [water planning and for administering water financing for the 21 22 state]. 23 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Section 6.012(a), Water Code, is amended to read as follows: 24 The board has general jurisdiction over:
- 25
- 26 (1) the development and implementation of a statewide
- 27 water plan;
- 28 the administration of the state's various water
- 29 assistance and financing programs, including those created by the

- 1 constitution and those created by Subchapters G and H of Chapter 15
- 2 of this code;
- 3 (3) the administration of the National Flood Insurance
- 4 Program; and
- 5 (4) other areas specifically assigned to the board by
- 6 this code or other law.
- 7 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Sections 6.052(a) and (b), Water Code, are
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The board is composed of six members who are appointed
- 10 by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate. One
- 11 member must have experience in the field of engineering, two
- 12 members must have experience in the field of public or private
- 13 finance, and one member must have experience in the field of law or
- 14 business.
- 15 (b) The governor shall make the appointments in such a
- 16 manner that the members reflect the diverse geographic regions and
- 17 population groups of this state [each member is from a different
- 18 section of the state and has no conflict of interest prohibited by
- 19 state or federal law].
- SECTION \_\_\_\_. Section 6.053(b), Water Code, is amended to
- 21 read as follows:
- (b) A person is not eligible for appointment to the board if
- 23 the person or the person's spouse:
- (1) is employed by or participates in the management
- 25 of a business entity or other organization regulated by the board or
- 26 receiving funds from the board;
- 27 (2) owns, controls, or has, directly or indirectly,
- 28 more than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other
- 29 organization regulated by the board or receiving funds from the
- 30 board; [or]
- 31 (3) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible

- goods, services, or funds from the board; or
- 2 (4) receives money from a business entity or other
- organization receiving funds from the board. 3
- 4 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Section 6.054, Water Code, is amended by
- amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read as 5
- 6 follows:
- 7 If a board member or a state employee [the executive
- administrator] has knowledge that a potential ground for removal
- exists, the board member or employee [executive administrator]
- 10 shall notify the chairman of the board of the potential ground. The
- chairman of the board shall then notify the governor and the 11
- attorney general that a potential ground for removal exists. If the 12
- potential ground for removal includes the chairman of the board, 13
- the board member or employee [executive administrator] shall notify 14
- the next highest ranking officer of the board, who shall then notify 15
- the governor and the attorney general that a potential ground for 16
- 17 removal exists.
- (d) The governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, 18
- may remove a board member from office as provided by Section 9, 19
- Article XV, Texas Constitution. 20
- SECTION \_\_\_\_. Subchapter C, Chapter 6, Water Code, is 21
- amended by adding Section 6.0545 to read as follows: 22
- 23 Sec. 6.0545. PROHIBITION ON SEEKING ANOTHER OFFICE. (a) A
- person may not seek nomination or election to another civil office 24
- of this state or of the United States while serving as a board 25
- 26 member.
- (b) If a board member files for nomination or election to 27
- another civil office of this state or of the United States, the 28
- 29 person's office as a board member immediately becomes vacant, and
- the governor shall appoint a successor. 30
- SECTION \_\_\_\_. Section 6.060(a), Water Code, is amended to 31

- read as follows:
- (a) The board shall meet at least once every [ether] month
- on a day and at a place within the state selected by it, subject to
- recesses at the discretion of the board. The chairman or two board
- 5 members may call a special meeting at any time by giving notice to
- 6 the other members.
- 7 SECTION \_\_\_\_. The heading to Section 6.062, Water Code, is
- amended to read as follows: 8
- 9 Sec. 6.062. REQUIRED TRAINING AND CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR
- 10 BOARD MEMBERS.
- 11 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Section 6.062, Water Code, is amended by
- amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (d), (e), (f), (g), 12
- and (h) to read as follows: 13
- 14 The staff of the board shall develop the training (b)
- 15 program. The training program must provide the person with
- information regarding: 16
- 17 the legislation that created the board;
- 18 the programs operated by the board;
- 19 (3) the role and functions of the board;
- 20 the rules of the board, with an emphasis on the
- rules that relate to disciplinary and investigatory authority; 21
- 22 the current budget for the board; (5)
- 23 (6) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
- 24 board;
- 25 (7) the requirements of:
- 26 (A) the open meetings law, Chapter 551,
- 27 Government Code;
- 28 the public information law, Chapter 552, (B)
- 29 Government Code;
- 30 the administrative procedure law, Chapter
- 2001, Government Code; and 31

- 1 (D) other laws relating to public officials,
- including conflict of interest laws; and 2
- 3 (8) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the
- board or the Texas Ethics Commission.
- (d) The staff of the board shall develop a continuing 5
- education program for board members.
- 7 (e) To the extent practicable, the entire board shall
- participate in the continuing education program at the same time.
- 9 (f) In the first year of a board member's term of office, the
- member must participate in at least 10 hours of continuing 10
- education consisting of a review of the information described by 11
- 12 Subsection (b).
- 13 (g) In each subsequent year of a board member's term of
- office, the member must participate in at least five hours of 14
- continuing education consisting of a review of the information 15
- described by Subsection (b). 16
- 17 (h) The board shall maintain records of each board member's
- participation in training and continuing education programs and 18
- make the records available to the public on request. 19
- 20 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Section 6.151, Water Code, is amended to read
- 21 as follows:
- 22 Sec. 6.151. AUDIT. The financial transactions and general
- operations of the board are subject to audit by the state auditor in 23
- accordance with Chapter 321, Government Code. 24
- 25 SECTION \_\_\_\_. The heading to Section 6.156, Water Code, is
- amended to read as follows: 26
- 27 Sec. 6.156. REPORTS TO GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE.
- 28 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Subchapter E, Chapter 6, Water Code, is
- amended by adding Section 6.1566 to read as follows: 29
- 30 Sec. 6.1566. REPORT ON IMPLEMENTATION OF STATE WATER PLAN.
- (a) The board shall prepare an annual report summarizing the 31

- board's progress in implementing the current state water plan. The
- report must include:
- 3 (1) the total number of applications for financial 4
- assistance for projects to implement the current state water plan 5
- that have been approved by the board since the plan was adopted and 6
- the dollar amount of financial assistance provided;
- 7 (2) the total number of applications for financial 8
- assistance for projects to implement the current state water plan 9
- that have been approved by the board since the preceding report
- regarding the plan was issued, if applicable, and the dollar amount 10
- of financial assistance provided; 11
- 12 (3) the total amount of water that will be developed, 13
- conserved, or reused on completion of the projects described by
- 14 Subdivision (1);
- 15 (4) the total amount of water that will be developed,
- conserved, or reused on completion of the projects described by 16
- Subdivision (2), if applicable; and 17
- 18 (5) the financial status of the state water 19
- implementation fund for Texas.
- 20 (b) The board shall submit the report to the governor, the
- lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, 21 22
- and each other member of the legislature. The board shall make the
- report available to the public. 23
- 24 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Subchapter F, Chapter 6, Water Code, 25
- amended by adding Section 6.182 to read as follows:
- 26 Sec. 6.182. STRATEGIC PLAN. (a) The board shall develop and
- regularly update a comprehensive strategic plan that specifies the 27
- long-term operational and organizational goals and mission of the 28
- 29 board.
- 30 (b) The board shall annually provide copies of the strategic
- 31 plan to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the

- house of representatives, and each other member of the legislature.
- SECTION \_\_\_\_. Subchapter B, Chapter 16, Water Code, is 2 3
- amended by adding Sections 16.025 and 16.026 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 16.025. PUBLIC AVAILABILITY OF APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDS 5
- FOR PROJECTS INCLUDED IN STATE WATER PLAN. The board shall make 6
- available to the public, including in an electronic format through
- the board's Internet website, each application filed with the board 7
- for funds for the implementation of a project that is included in 8
- the state water plan.
- 10 Sec. 16.026. PUBLIC AVAILABILITY OF INFORMATION ON STATUS
- OF PROJECTS INCLUDED IN STATE WATER PLAN THAT ARE FUNDED BY BOARD. 11 12
- The board shall prepare and make available to the public, including 13
- in an electronic format through the board's Internet website,
- information about the status of each project that is included in the 14
- state water plan for which the board provides funds. 15
- SECTION \_\_\_\_. Sections 6.001(2) and 6.103, Water Code, are 16
- 17 repealed.
- 18 SECTION \_\_\_\_. The changes in law made by this Act in the
- qualifications of members of the Texas Water Development Board do 19
- not affect the entitlement of a member serving on the board 20
- immediately before the effective date of this Act to continue to 21
- carry out the board's functions for the remainder of the member's 22
- 23 term. The changes in law apply only to a member appointed on or
- after the effective date of this Act. This Act does not prohibit a 24
- person who is a member of the board on the effective date of this Act 25
- from being reappointed to the board if the person has the 26
- qualifications required for a member under Section 6.052, Water 27
- Code, as amended by this Act. 28
