1	Amend C.S. \leq .B. No. $\frac{213}{21}$ (housing committee printing) by
2	adding the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill
3	and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:
4	SECTION Subtitle G, Title 4, Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 512 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 512. TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE
7	OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE
8	Sec. 512.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Committee" means the Texas Department of Criminal
10	Justice Oversight Committee.
11	(2) "Correctional facility" means a facility operated
12	by or under contract with the department.
13	Sec. 512.002. ESTABLISHMENT; COMPOSITION. (a) The
14	committee is established to provide a continuing program of
15	inspection and oversight for each correctional facility.
16	(b) The committee is composed of eight members as follows:
17	(1) four members of the senate appointed by the
18	lieutenant governor, not more than two of whom are members of the
19	same political party; and
20	(2) four members of the house of representatives
21	appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, not more
22	than two of whom are members of the same political party.
23	(c) In making appointments to the committee, the lieutenant
24	governor or the speaker of the house of representatives, as
25	applicable, shall give first consideration to members of the Senate
26	Committee on Criminal Justice or the House Committee on
27	Corrections.
28	(d) A member of the committee serves at the pleasure of the
29	appointing official.

- 1 (e) Not later than the 15th day after the date a regular
- 2 session of the legislature convenes, the lieutenant governor and
- 3 the speaker of the house of representatives shall make appointments
- 4 to the committee under this section.
- 5 Sec. 512.003. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Each member of the
- 6 committee serves a term beginning on the date the member is
- 7 appointed and ending on the date the next regular session of the
- 8 <u>legislature convenes</u>, unless the member ceases to be a member of the
- 9 <u>legislature</u>.
- 10 (b) If a vacancy occurs during a member's term, the
- 11 appropriate appointing official shall appoint a qualified person to
- 12 serve for the unexpired term.
- Sec. 512.004. PRESIDING OFFICER. (a) The lieutenant
- 14 governor and the speaker of the house of representatives shall
- 15 appoint the presiding officer of the committee on an alternating
- 16 basis.
- 17 (b) The term of a presiding officer of the committee may not
- 18 exceed two years.
- 19 Sec. 512.005. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of
- 20 the committee serves without compensation for service on the
- 21 committee but is entitled to reimbursement for travel and other
- 22 necessary expenses as provided by Chapter 660 and the General
- 23 Appropriations Act.
- Sec. 512.006. STAFF; AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT. (a) The
- 25 committee shall employ a director and other staff and may contract
- 26 for the provision of services as necessary to carry out the
- 27 committee's duties.
- (b) The committee shall direct the work of the director and
- 29 staff of the committee.
- 30 (c) The committee may not employ a person who is employed by
- 31 or affiliated with or who contracts to provide services to:

-	(1) the department, therading an embademan program
2	operated by the department; or
3	(2) the board.
4	Sec. 512.007. COMPENSATION OF STAFF. (a) The director
5	shall receive a salary and compensation in an amount determined by
6	the presiding officer of the committee.
7	(b) The director shall determine the salaries and
8	compensation of other committee staff.
9	Sec. 512.008. COMMITTEE POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The
10	<pre>committee shall:</pre>
11	(1) provide for the regular inspection of each
12	correctional facility; and
13	(2) submit reports to the board and the legislature,
14	in accordance with Subsection (c), that include:
15	(A) the results of the committee's inspections
16	since the most recent inspections included in a report to the board
17	or legislature, as applicable, including an evaluation of the
18	inmate grievance procedure at each inspected facility; and
19	(B) any recommendations concerning policy
20	changes or other means by which to improve the conditions or
21	operations of correctional facilities in this state.
22	(b) The committee shall ensure that:
23	(1) not fewer than a total of 25 correctional
24	facilities are inspected each two-year period, including not fewer
25	than 5 correctional facilities that are operated under contract
26	with the department; and
27	(2) each inspection includes one or more visitations
28	during:
29	(A) a general meal period; and
30	(B) a rehabilitative or educational program.
31	(c) The committee shall submit a report to:

- 1 (1) the board once every six months at a regularly
- 2 scheduled meeting of the board; and
- 3 (2) the legislature once every two years not later
- 4 than the 15th day after the date a regular session of the
- 5 <u>legislature</u> convenes.
- 6 Sec. 512.009. COMMUNICATION AND CONFIDENTIALITY. (a) The
- 7 department shall:
- 8 (1) allow a member of the committee or its staff to
- 9 access any part of a correctional facility, without advance notice,
- 10 for the purpose of conducting an inspection; and
- 11 (2) allow any person imprisoned or confined in a
- 12 correctional facility, or any correctional officer or other person
- 13 employed at a correctional facility, to communicate in person, by
- 14 mail, or by any other means with a member of the committee or its
- 15 staff.
- (b) The department may not open or inspect any letter
- 17 between a member of the committee or its staff and a person
- 18 imprisoned or confined in a correctional facility.
- (c) The department may not take any adverse action against a
- 20 person imprisoned or confined in a correctional facility or
- 21 employed by a correctional facility as a result of a communication
- 22 between the person and a member of the committee or its staff.
- 23 (d) A communication described by Subsection (a)(2) is
- 24 confidential and not subject to public disclosure under Chapter 552
- 25 or other law.
- Sec. 512.010. PUBLIC AND INMATE AWARENESS. The committee
- 27 shall make available to the public and any person imprisoned or
- 28 <u>confined in a correctional facility information regarding:</u>
- (1) the manner by which the committee may be
- 30 contacted; and
- 31 (2) the purpose, duties, and responsibilities of the

committee.

- 2 Sec. 512.011. OTHER LAW. The committee is not subject to
- 3 <u>Chapter 2110.</u>
- 4 SECTION ____. Not later than the 60th day after the
- 5 effective date of this Act, the lieutenant governor and the speaker
- 6 of the house of representatives shall appoint the initial members
- 7 to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Oversight Committee
- 8 under Chapter 512, Government Code, as added by this Act.
