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Amend $\leq$ .B. No. $\frac{\partial R}{\partial B}$ (House committee printing) by adding the
following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and
renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:
SECTION Section 501.054, Government Code, is amended
to read as follows:
Sec. 501.054. AIDS, [AND] HIV, AND HEPATITIS EDUCATION;
TESTING. (a) In this section:

- 8 (1) [7] "AIDS[7]" and "HIV[7]" [and "test result"]
- 9 have the meanings assigned by Section 81.101, Health and Safety 10 Code.
- 11 (2) "Test result" means any statement that indicates
- 12 that an individual has or has not been tested for a particular
- 13 disease or condition. The term includes a test result described by
- 14 Section 81.101, Health and Safety Code.

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- 15 (b) The department, in consultation with the [Texas]
- 16 Department of State Health Services, shall establish education
- 17 programs to educate inmates and employees of the department about
- 18 AIDS, [and] HIV, and hepatitis. In establishing the programs for
- 19 inmates, the department shall design a program that deals with
- 20 issues related to AIDS, [and] HIV, and hepatitis that are relevant
- 21 to inmates while confined and a program that deals with issues
- 22 related to AIDS, [and] HIV, and hepatitis that will be relevant to
- 23 inmates after the inmates are released. The department shall design
- 24 the programs to take into account relevant cultural and other
- 25 differences among inmates. The department shall require each
- 26 inmate in a facility operated by the department to participate in
- 27 education programs established under this subsection.
- 28 (c) The department shall require each employee of the
- 29 department to participate in programs established under this

- 1 section at least once during each calendar year.
- 2 (d) The department shall ensure that education programs for
- 3 employees include information and training relating to infection
- 4 control procedures. The department shall also ensure that
- 5 employees have infection control supplies and equipment readily
- 6 available.
- 7 (e) The department, in consultation with the [Texas]
- 8 Department of <u>State</u> Health <u>Services</u>, shall periodically revise
- 9 education programs established under this section so that the
- 10 programs reflect the latest medical information available on AIDS,
- 11 [and] HIV, and hepatitis.
- 12 (f) The department shall adopt a policy for handling persons
- 13 who have [with] AIDS or hepatitis or are infected with HIV and
- 14 [infection who] are in the custody of the department or under the
- 15 department's supervision. The policy for handling persons who have
- 16 AIDS or are infected with HIV must be substantially similar to a
- 17 model policy developed [by the Texas Department of Health] under
- 18 Subchapter G, Chapter 85, Health and Safety Code.
- 19 (g) The department shall maintain the confidentiality of
- 20 test results of an inmate indicating the presence of hepatitis or
- 21 HIV infection at all times, including after the inmate's discharge,
- 22 release from a state jail, or release on parole or mandatory
- 23 supervision. The department may not honor the request of an agency
- 24 of the state or any person who requests a test result as a condition
- 25 of housing or supervising the inmate while the inmate is on
- 26 community supervision or parole or mandatory supervision, unless
- 27 honoring the request would improve the ability of the inmate to
- 28 obtain essential health and social services.
- 29 (h) The department shall report to the legislature not later
- 30 than January 15 of each odd-numbered year concerning the
- 31 implementation of this section and the participation of inmates and

- 1 employees of the department in education programs established under
- 2 this section.
- 3 (i) The department may test an inmate confined in a facility
- 4 operated by the correctional institutions division for hepatitis or
- 5 <u>HIV infection</u> [human immunodeficiency virus] at any time, but must
- 6 test:
- 7 (1) during the diagnostic process, an inmate for whom
- 8 the department does not have a record of a positive test result; and
- 9 (2) an inmate who is eligible for release before the
- 10 inmate is released from the division.
- 11 (j) If the department determines that an inmate has a
- 12 positive test result, the department may segregate the inmate from
- 13 other inmates. The department shall report the results of a
- 14 positive test to the Department of State Health Services for the
- 15 purposes of notification and reporting as described by Sections
- 16 81.050-81.052, Health and Safety Code.
- 17 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Section 507.023, Government Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 507.023. AIDS, [AND] HIV, AND HEPATITIS EDUCATION;
- 20 TESTING. (a) The department [state jail division] shall establish
- 21 and provide education programs to educate [state-jail division]
- 22 employees at and defendants in state jail felony facilities about
- 23 AIDS, [and] HIV, and hepatitis in the same manner as the department
- 24 [institutional division] establishes and provides programs for
- 25 employees and inmates under Section 501.054.
- 26 (b) The department [state jail division] shall adopt a
- 27 policy for handling a defendant with AIDS, [ex] HIV, or hepatitis
- 28 and shall test a defendant for AIDS, hepatitis, or HIV infection in
- 29 the same manner and subject to the same conditions as apply to an
- 30 inmate [the institutional division] under Section 501.054.
- 31 (c) In this section, "AIDS" and "HIV" have the meanings

- 1 assigned by Section 81.101, Health and Safety Code.
- 2 SECTION \_\_\_\_\_. The Texas Department of Criminal Justice
- 3 shall establish the programs, adopt the policies, and initiate the
- 4 testing procedures required by Sections 501.054 and 507.023,
- 5 Government Code, as amended by this Act, not later than January 1,
- 6 2014.
