## BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

Interested parties note that current state law requires that the chair and vice chair of a political party consist of one man and one woman and point out that a high court decision has held that states cannot impose these kind of rules on political parties. H.B. 1866 seeks to remove the gender requirements for these party positions.

## RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

It is the committee's opinion that this bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, department, agency, or institution.

## ANALYSIS

H.B. 1866 amends the Election Code to remove the requirement that either the chair or vice chair of the state executive committee for a political party nominating by primary election be a man and the other member be a woman.

## EFFECTIVE DATE

On passage, or, if the bill does not receive the necessary vote, September 1, 2013.
