- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 54.017 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 54.017. FIXED TUITION PRICE PLAN FOR UNDERGRADUATE
- 9 STUDENTS AT CERTAIN GENERAL ACADEMIC TEACHING INSTITUTIONS. (a)
- 10 In this section, "general academic teaching institution" and
- 11 "public state college" have the meanings assigned by Section
- 12 <u>61.003.</u>
- 13 (b) This section applies only to a general academic teaching
- 14 institution other than a public state college.
- 15 (c) The governing board of an institution to which this
- 16 section applies shall offer entering undergraduate students,
- 17 including undergraduate students who transfer to the institution,
- 18 the opportunity to participate in a fixed tuition price plan under
- 19 which the institution agrees not to increase tuition charges per
- 20 semester credit hour for a participating student for at least the
- 21 first 12 consecutive semesters that occur after the date of the
- 22 student's initial enrollment at any public or private institution
- 23 of higher education, regardless of whether the student enrolls at
- 24 any institution in those semesters, and subject to any restrictions

- 1 or qualifications adopted by the governing board. For purposes of
- 2 this section, one or more summer terms occurring in the same summer
- 3 is considered a semester.
- 4 (d) Unless the institution does not offer other tuition
- 5 payment options, an institution to which this section applies may
- 6 require an entering undergraduate student to accept or reject
- 7 participation in the fixed tuition price plan offered under this
- 8 section before the date of the student's initial enrollment at the
- 9 institution.
- 10 (e) This section does not require an institution to which
- 11 this <u>section</u> applies to offer a variable tuition price plan or other
- 12 tuition payment options to undergraduate students enrolled in the
- 13 institution.
- 14 (f) Fees charged by an institution to a student
- 15 participating in a fixed tuition price plan under this section may
- 16 not exceed the fees charged by the institution to a similarly
- 17 situated student who elects not to participate in the plan, if the
- 18 institution offers other tuition payment options. For purposes of
- 19 this subsection, students are similarly situated if they share the
- 20 same residency status, degree program, course load, course level,
- 21 and other circumstances affecting the fees charged to the students.
- 22 (g) This section does not apply to the tuition charged by an
- 23 <u>institution to which this section applies to a student who enters</u>
- 24 the institution for the first time before the 2014 fall semester.
- 25 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
