A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to requiring general academic teaching institutions to
- 3 offer a fixed tuition rate plan to undergraduate students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 54.017 to read as follows:
- 7 <u>Sec. 54.017.</u> FIXED TUITION RATE OPTION FOR UNDERGRADUATE
- 8 STUDENTS AT GENERAL ACADEMIC TEACHING INSTITUTIONS. (a) In this
- 9 section:
- 10 (1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
- 11 Education Coordinating Board.
- 12 (2) "General academic teaching institution" has the
- 13 meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
- 14 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter and
- 15 except as otherwise provided by this section, the governing board
- 16 of a general academic teaching institution shall offer each
- 17 entering undergraduate student, including each undergraduate
- 18 student who transfers to the institution regardless of the number
- 19 of semester credit hours transferred by the student, the
- 20 opportunity to participate in a fixed tuition rate plan.
- 21 (c) A fixed tuition rate plan offered under this section
- 22 must provide that:
- 23 (1) during the 48 months immediately following the
- 24 date of a student's initial enrollment at the general academic

- 1 teaching institution, the institution may not charge tuition to the
- 2 student for a semester or other academic term at a rate that exceeds
- 3 the rate the institution would have charged the student for the same
- 4 courses during:
- 5 (A) the first academic year in which the student
- 6 <u>enrolled at the institution</u>, if the student initially enrolled for
- 7 <u>a fall or spring semester; or</u>
- 8 (B) the academic year immediately following the
- 9 summer term in which the student enrolled at the institution, if the
- 10 student initially enrolled for a summer term; and
- 11 (2) after the fourth anniversary of the date the
- 12 student first enrolls at the institution, regardless of whether the
- 13 student is continuously enrolled in the institution after that
- 14 initial enrollment, the institution may not charge tuition to the
- 15 student for a semester or other academic term at a rate that exceeds
- 16 the rate the institution would have charged the student under
- 17 Subdivision (1) had the student initially enrolled in the
- 18 institution one year after the student's actual initial enrollment.
- 19 (d) A fixed tuition rate charged to a student by a general
- 20 academic teaching institution under Subsection (c) does not apply
- 21 to the student after the student has been awarded a baccalaureate
- 22 degree by the institution. A student who previously completed a
- 23 baccalaureate degree program at the institution is considered to be
- 24 an entering undergraduate student for purposes of this section if
- 25 the student subsequently enrolls in another undergraduate degree
- 26 program at the institution.
- (e) Each general academic teaching institution shall notify

- 1 <u>each entering undergraduate student</u>, including each undergraduate
- 2 student who transfers to the institution, of the fixed tuition rate
- 3 plan offered under this section.
- 4 (f) In consultation with the general academic teaching
- 5 institutions, the coordinating board shall adopt any rules the
- 6 coordinating board considers appropriate for the administration of
- 7 this section.
- 8 <u>(g) This section does not require a general academic</u>
- 9 teaching institution to offer an alternative tuition plan to
- 10 undergraduate students enrolled in the institution.
- 11 (h) This section does not apply to the tuition charged by a
- 12 general academic teaching institution to a student who enters the
- 13 institution for the first time before the 2013 fall semester. This
- 14 <u>subsection expires January 1, 2020.</u>
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
