- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as Caylee's Law.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 38, Penal Code, is amended by adding
- 7 Sections 38.20 and 38.21 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 38.20. FAILURE TO REPORT MISSING CHILD. (a) A person
- 9 who has custody, care, or control of a child commits an offense if
- 10 the person:

- 11 (1) knows or should have known that the child
- 12 disappeared or otherwise became missing while in the person's
- 13 custody, care, or control; and

- 14 (2) does not make a timely report to law enforcement
- 15 authorities that the child disappeared or became missing.
- 16 (b) In this section, "child" means a person younger than 18
- 17 years of age.
- (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), an offense under
- 19 this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 20 (d) An offense under this section is a state jail felony if
- 21 the child suffers serious bodily injury, permanent disability, or
- 22 permanent disfigurement while missing.
- Sec. 38.21. FAILURE TO REPORT DEATH OF CHILD. (a) A person
- 24 who has custody, care, or control of a child commits an offense if

- 1 the person:
- 2 (1) knows or should have known that the child died
- 3 while in the person's custody, care, or control; and
- 4 (2) does not make a timely report of the child's death
- 5 to law enforcement authorities or to the county coroner, medical
- 6 <u>examiner</u>, or justice of the peace acting as coroner or medical
- 7 examiner.
- 8 (b) In this section, "child" means a person younger than 18
- 9 years of age.
- 10 (c) An offense under this section is a state jail felony.
- 11 (d) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that
- 12 the child died:
- 13 <u>(1) in a medical facility; or</u>
- 14 (2) in the care of a physician, a health care
- 15 practitioner, or emergency services personnel and was subsequently
- 16 pronounced dead by a person legally authorized to make that
- 17 determination.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
