A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the administration to public school students in certain
3	grades of state-administered assessment instruments.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 21.4551(b), Education Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(b) A reading academy developed under this section must
8	include training in:
9	(1) [for a teacher providing instruction in reading to
10	students at the seventh or eighth grade level:
11	[(A) administration of the reading instrument
12	required by Section 28.006(c-1); and
13	[(B) interpretation of the results of the reading
14	instrument required by Section 28.006(c-1) and strategies, based on
15	scientific research regarding effective reading instruction, for
16	long-term intensive intervention to target identified student
17	needs in word recognition, vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension;
18	$\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ for a teacher providing instruction in reading
19	to students at the sixth, seventh, or eighth grade level:
20	(A) strategies to be implemented in English
21	language arts and other subject areas for multisyllable word
22	reading, vocabulary development, and comprehension of expository
23	and narrative text;
24	(B) an adaptation framework that enables

- 1 teachers to respond to differing student strengths and needs,
- 2 including adaptations for students of limited English proficiency
- 3 or students receiving special education services under Subchapter
- 4 A, Chapter 29;
- 5 (C) collaborative strategies to increase active
- 6 student involvement and motivation to read; and
- 7 (D) other areas identified by the commissioner as
- 8 essential components of reading instruction; and
- 9 $\underline{(2)}$ [$\overline{(3)}$] for a teacher providing instruction in
- 10 mathematics, science, or social studies to students at the sixth,
- 11 seventh, or eighth grade level:
- 12 (A) strategies for incorporating reading
- 13 instruction into the curriculum for the subject area taught by the
- 14 teacher; and
- 15 (B) other areas identified by the commissioner.
- SECTION 2. Sections 28.0211(a) and (f), Education Code, are
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) or (e), a student
- 19 may not be promoted to [+
- 20 $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$ the sixth grade program to which the student
- 21 would otherwise be assigned if the student does not perform
- 22 satisfactorily on the fifth grade mathematics and reading
- 23 assessment instruments under Section 39.023[+ or
- 24 [(2) the ninth grade program to which the student
- 25 would otherwise be assigned if the student does not perform
- 26 satisfactorily on the eighth grade mathematics and reading
- 27 assessment instruments under Section 39.023].

- 1 A school district shall provide to a student who, after three attempts, has failed to perform satisfactorily on an 2 3 assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) accelerated instruction during the next school year as prescribed by an 4 5 educational plan developed for the student by the student's grade placement committee established under Subsection (c). The district 6 shall provide that accelerated instruction regardless of whether 7 8 the student has been promoted or retained. The educational plan must be designed to enable the student to perform at the appropriate 9 10 grade level by the conclusion of the school year. During the school year, the student shall be monitored to ensure that the student is 11 12 progressing in accordance with the plan. The district shall administer to the student the assessment instrument for the grade 13 14 level in which the student is placed or the assessment instrument required under Section 39.023(a-4), as applicable, at the time the 15 16 district regularly administers the assessment instruments for that 17 school year.
- SECTION 3. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (a-1) and adding Subsections (a-3), (a-4), (a-5), (a-6), (a-7), and (a-8) to read as follows:
- (a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess essential knowledge and skills in reading, writing, mathematics, social studies, and science. Except as provided by Subsection (a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection (b) or (l) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
- 27 (1) mathematics, [annually] in grades three, five, and

- 1 [through] seven without the aid of technology [and in grade eight
- 2 with the aid of technology on any assessment instrument that
- 3 includes algebra];
- 4 (2) reading, [annually] in grades three, five, and
- 5 seven [through eight];
- 6 (3) writing, including spelling and grammar, in grades
- 7 four and seven;
- 8 (4) social studies, in grade eight;
- 9 (5) science, in grades five and eight; and
- 10 (6) any other subject and grade required by federal
- 11 law.
- 12 (a-1) The agency shall develop assessment instruments
- 13 required under Subsections (a), (a-3), (a-4), and (a-5) [Subsection
- 14 $\frac{(a)}{(a)}$] in a manner that allows, to the extent practicable:
- 15 (1) the score a student receives to provide reliable
- 16 information relating to a student's satisfactory performance for
- 17 each performance standard under Section 39.0241; and
- 18 (2) an appropriate range of performances to serve as a
- 19 valid indication of growth in student achievement.
- 20 (a-3) A student shall be assessed in grade four in a subject
- 21 for which an assessment instrument is administered under Subsection
- 22 (a) in grade three if, on the final assessment instrument in that
- 23 <u>subject administered under Subsection (a) to the student in grade</u>
- 24 three during the preceding school year, the student did not achieve
- 25 <u>a scale score equal to or greater than the scale score that</u>
- 26 indicates satisfactory performance on that assessment instrument,
- 27 as determined by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a).

1 (a-4) A student promoted for performing at grade level on an alternate assessment instrument under Section 28.0211(b) or by a 2 grade placement committee under Section 28.0211(e) shall be 3 assessed in grade six in a subject for which an assessment 4 5 instrument is administered under Subsection (a)(1) or (2) in grade five if, on the final assessment instrument in that subject 6 administered under Subsection (a) to the student in grade five 7 8 during the preceding school year, the student did not achieve a scale score equal to or greater than the scale score that indicates 9 satisfactory performance on that assessment instrument, as 10 determined by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a). 11 12 (a-5) A student shall be assessed in grade eight in a subject for which an assessment instrument is administered under 13 14 Subsection (a)(1) or (2) in grade seven if, on the final assessment 15 instrument in that subject administered under Subsection (a) to the student in grade seven during the preceding school year, the 16 17 student did not achieve a scale score equal to or greater than the scale score that indicates satisfactory performance on that 18 assessment instrument, as determined by the commissioner under 19 Section 39.0241(a). 20 21 (a-6) A student assessed in mathematics under Subsection (a-3), (a-4), or (a-5) shall be assessed without the aid of 22 23 technology. 24 (a-7) The results of an assessment instrument administered

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under Subsection (a-3), (a-4), or (a-5) may not be included as a

student achievement indicator under Section 39.053 or any other

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provision.

- 1 (a-8) If there is a conflict between this section and
- 2 federal law as a result of forgoing under this section certain
- 3 <u>administration of assessment instruments to students who have</u>
- 4 recently performed successfully on assessment instruments
- 5 assessing the same subject, the commissioner shall seek a waiver
- 6 from the application of conflicting federal law.
- 7 SECTION 4. Section 39.054(b-1), Education Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (b-1) Consideration of the effectiveness of district
- 10 programs under Section 39.052(b)(2)(B) or (C):
- 11 (1) must:
- 12 (A) be based on data collected through the Public
- 13 Education Information Management System (PEIMS) for purposes of
- 14 accountability under this chapter; and
- 15 (B) include the results of assessments required
- 16 under <u>Sections 39.023(a)</u>, (b), (c), and (l) [Section 39.023]; and
- 17 (2) may be based on the results of a special
- 18 accreditation investigation conducted under Section 39.057.
- SECTION 5. Sections 28.006(c-1) and (g-1), Education Code,
- 20 are repealed.
- 21 SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 22 school year.
- 23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
