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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to entities that qualify as historically underutilized 3 businesses. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 2161.001(2), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (2) "Historically underutilized business" means an 8 entity: 9 (A) with its principal place of business in this 10 state that is: 11 (i) [<del>(A)</del>] a corporation formed for the 12 purpose of making a profit in which 51 percent or more of all classes of the shares of stock or other equitable securities are 13 owned by one or more economically disadvantaged persons who have a 14 15 proportionate interest and actively participate in the 16 corporation's control, operation, and management; 17 (ii) [(B)] a sole proprietorship created for the purpose of making a profit that is completely owned, 18 operated, and controlled by an economically disadvantaged person; 19 20 (iii) [(C)] a partnership formed for the purpose of making a profit in which 51 percent or more of the assets 21 22 and interest in the partnership are owned by one or more 23 economically disadvantaged persons who have a proportionate interest and actively participate in the partnership's control, 24

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1 operation, and management;

2 <u>(iv)</u> [<del>(D)</del>] a joint venture in which each 3 entity in the venture is a historically underutilized business, as 4 determined under another <u>subparagraph</u> [<del>paragraph</del>] of this 5 <u>paragraph</u> [<del>subdivision</del>]; or

6 <u>(v)</u> [<del>(E)</del>] a supplier contract between a 7 historically underutilized business as determined under another 8 <u>subparagraph</u> [<del>paragraph</del>] of this <u>paragraph</u> [<del>subdivision</del>] and a 9 prime contractor under which the historically underutilized 10 business is directly involved in the manufacture or distribution of 11 the goods or otherwise warehouses and ships the goods; or

12 (B) with one or more places of business each 13 located in the unincorporated area of a county with a population of 14 <u>60,000 or less</u>.

15 SECTION 2. Section 2161.0015, Government Code, is amended 16 to read as follows:

Sec. 2161.0015. DETERMINING 17 STZE STANDARDS FOR HISTORICALLY UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES. 18 The comptroller [commission] may establish size standards that a business may not 19 exceed if it is to be considered a historically underutilized 20 21 business under this chapter. In determining the size standards, the comptroller [commission] shall determine the size at which: 22

23 (1) a business <u>described by Section 2161.001(2)(A)</u> 24 should be considered sufficiently large that the business probably 25 does not significantly suffer from the effects of past 26 discriminatory practices; or

27 (2) a business described by Section 2161.001(2)(B)

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1	should be considered sufficiently large that the business probably
2	does not significantly suffer from the effects of geographic
3	location.
4	SECTION 3. Section 2161.125, Government Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 2161.125. CATEGORIZATION BY SEX, RACE, [AND]
7	ETHNICITY, AND GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION. The comptroller, in
8	cooperation with each state agency reporting under this subchapter,
9	shall categorize each historically underutilized business included
10	in a report under this subchapter by sex, race, [and] ethnicity, and
11	geographic location.
12	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
