## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the use of radio frequency identification technology to
- 3 transmit information regarding public school students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 25, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 25.902 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 25.902. CERTAIN MANDATORY STUDENT IDENTIFICATION
- 8 METHODS PROHIBITED. (a) In this section, "radio frequency
- 9 <u>identification technology" means a wireless identification system</u>
- 10 that uses a battery or other active power source to broadcast a
- 11 constant electromagnetic radio frequency signal to transmit data
- 12 without physical contact between a card, badge, or tag and another
- 13 <u>device.</u>
- 14 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a school district
- 15 may require a student to use an identification device that uses
- 16 radio frequency identification technology or similar technology to
- 17 identify the student, transmit information regarding the student,
- 18 or track the location of the student only if authorized by
- 19 resolution adopted by the board of trustees of the district.
- 20 <u>(c) On the timely written request of a student's parent or</u>
- 21 guardian, a school district shall permit the student to opt out of
- 22 use of an identification device described by Subsection (b). If a
- 23 student's parent or guardian requests that the student opt out of
- 24 the use of the device, the district shall provide an alternative

- 2 (d) A school district may not penalize a student using an
- 3 alternative method of identification under Subsection (c),
- 4 including restricting or prohibiting the student from
- 5 participating in school or district activities.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
