A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the dissemination of criminal history record
3 information by the Department of Public Safety concerning the
4 offense of intoxication manslaughter.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 411.135(a), Government Code, is amended
7 to read as follows:

8 (a) Any person is entitled to obtain from the department:

9 (1) any information described as public information
10 under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure, [~~as added by Chapter~~
11 ~~668, Acts of the 75th Legislature, Regular Session, 1997,~~]
12 including, to the extent available, a recent photograph of each
13 person subject to registration under that chapter; [~~and~~]

14 (2) criminal history record information maintained by
15 the department that relates to the conviction of or a grant of
16 deferred adjudication to a person for any criminal offense,
17 including arrest information that relates to the conviction or
18 grant of deferred adjudication; and

19 (3) any information described as public information
20 under Section 411.1356(a).

21 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
22 amended by adding Sections 411.1356 and 411.1357 to read as
23 follows:

24 Sec. 411.1356. PUBLIC ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD

1 INFORMATION CONCERNING OFFENSE OF INTOXICATION MANSLAUGHTER. (a)
2 Criminal history record information that concerns a person's
3 conviction within the preceding 10-year period for an offense under
4 Section 49.08, Penal Code, is public information, with the
5 exception of:

6 (1) any information regarding the person's social
7 security number, driver's license number, or telephone number; and

8 (2) any information that would identify a victim of
9 the offense.

10 (b) The department shall implement and maintain an Internet
11 website to allow any person, free of charge, to electronically
12 search for and receive information described by Subsection (a).
13 The website must be searchable by zip code, city, county, or the
14 name of the person convicted. The search results must include for
15 each person convicted:

16 (1) the person's full name and last known address; and

17 (2) a recent photograph of the person, if a photograph
18 is available to the department.

19 (c) The department shall remove the criminal history record
20 information concerning a person's conviction for an offense under
21 Section 49.08, Penal Code, from the Internet website as soon as
22 practicable after the earliest of:

23 (1) the 10th anniversary of the date of the
24 conviction;

25 (2) the date on which the conviction is reversed on
26 appeal; or

27 (3) the date on which an order of expunction is entered

1 with respect to records and files in the case.

2 Sec. 411.1357. CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION
3 CONCERNING OFFENSE OF INTOXICATION MANSLAUGHTER PROVIDED TO PEACE
4 OFFICER ON REQUEST. (a) The department shall establish a procedure
5 by which a peace officer or employee of a law enforcement agency who
6 provides the department with a driver's license number, personal
7 identification certificate number, or license plate number may be
8 provided any criminal history record information maintained by the
9 department concerning a conviction of the person to whom the
10 license, certificate, or plate is issued for an offense under
11 Section 49.08, Penal Code, within the preceding 10-year period.

12 (b) The procedure established under Subsection (a) must
13 allow a peace officer to request the information from the location
14 of a motor vehicle stop and to receive a response to the request
15 within the duration of a reasonable motor vehicle stop.

16 SECTION 3. Not later than May 1, 2014, the Department of
17 Public Safety shall implement the Internet website required under
18 Section 411.1356, Government Code, as added by this Act, and shall
19 make available to a requesting person the information described by
20 Section 411.1356 or 411.1357, Government Code, as added by this
21 Act.

22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
