6	SECTION 1. Section 2161.001(3), Government Code, is amended		
7	to read as follows:		
8	(3) "Economically disadvantaged person" means a		
9	person who:		
10	(A) is economically disadvantaged because of the		
11	person's identification as a member of a certain group, including:		
12	<u>(i)</u> Black Americans <u>;</u>		
13	(ii) [→] Hispanic Americans;		
14	<pre>(iii) [7] women;</pre>		
15	(iv)[7] Asian Pacific Americans;		
16	$\underline{(v)}[{\color{red} {m{ and}}}]$ Native Americans $\underline{{\color{blue} {m{ and}}}}[{\color{red} {m{ and}}}]$ and		
17	(vi) veterans as defined by 38 U.S.C.		
18	Section 101(2) who have suffered at least a 20 percent		
19	service-connected disability as defined by 38 U.S.C. Section		
20	101(16); and		
21	(B) [who] has suffered the effects of		
22	discriminatory practices or other similar insidious circumstances		
23	over which the person has no control.		
24	SECTION 2. Section 2161.002, Government Code, is amended by		

- 1 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 2 (d) The comptroller shall adopt rules to provide goals for
- 3 increasing the contract awards for the purchase of goods or
- 4 services by the commission and other state agencies to businesses
- 5 that qualify as historically underutilized businesses because the
- 6 businesses are owned or owned, operated, and controlled, as
- 7 applicable, wholly or partly by one or more veterans as defined by
- 8 38 U.S.C. Section 101(2) who have a service-connected disability as
- 9 defined by 38 U.S.C. Section 101(16). The goals established under
- 10 this subsection are in addition to the goals established under
- 11 Subsection (c) and the goals established under Subsection (c) may
- 12 not be reduced as a result of the establishment of goals under this
- 13 <u>subsection</u>.
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 2161.125, Government Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 2161.125. CATEGORIZATION OF HISTORICALLY
- 17 UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES [BY SEX, RACE, AND ETHNICITY]. The
- 18 comptroller, in cooperation with each state agency reporting under
- 19 this subchapter, shall categorize each historically underutilized
- 20 business included in a report under this subchapter by sex, race,
- 21 and ethnicity and by whether the business qualifies as a
- 22 historically underutilized business because it is owned or owned,
- 23 operated, and controlled, as applicable, wholly or partly by one or
- 24 more veterans as defined by 38 U.S.C. Section 101(2) who have
- 25 suffered at least a 20 percent service-connected disability as
- 26 <u>defined by 38 U.S.C. Section 101(16)</u>.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
