A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to considering ownership interests of certain disabled
- 3 veterans in determining whether a business is a historically
- 4 underutilized business for purposes of state contracting.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 2161.001(3), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (3) "Economically disadvantaged person" means a
- 9 person who is economically disadvantaged because of the person's
- 10 identification as a member of a certain group, including Black
- 11 Americans, Hispanic Americans, women, Asian Pacific Americans,
- 12 [and] Native Americans, and veterans as defined by 38 U.S.C.
- 13 <u>Section 101(2) who have a service-connected disability as defined</u>
- 14 by 38 U.S.C. Section 101(16), and who has suffered the effects of
- 15 discriminatory practices or other similar insidious circumstances
- 16 over which the person has no control.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 2161.125, Government Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 2161.125. CATEGORIZATION OF HISTORICALLY
- 20 <u>UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES</u> [BY SEX, RACE, AND ETHNICITY]. The
- 21 comptroller, in cooperation with each state agency reporting under
- 22 this subchapter, shall categorize each historically underutilized
- 23 business included in a report under this subchapter by sex, race,
- 24 and ethnicity and by whether the business qualifies as a

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- 1 <u>historically underutilized business because it is owned or owned</u>,
- 2 operated, and controlled, as applicable, wholly or partly by one or
- 3 more veterans as defined by 38 U.S.C. Section 101(2) who have a
- 4 service-connected disability as defined by 38 U.S.C. Section
- 5 101(16).
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
