4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 533, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Sections 533.051, 533.052, and 533.053
7	to read as follows:
8	Sec. 533.051. ALLOCATION OF BEDS IN STATE HOSPITALS. (a)
9	The commission shall plan separately for the allocation of beds in
10	the state hospitals for the following two groups of patients:
11	(1) patients who are voluntarily admitted to a state
12	hospital under Chapter 572, admitted to a state hospital for
13	emergency detention under Chapter 573, or ordered by a court to
14	receive inpatient mental health services at a state hospital under
15	Chapter 574; and
16	(2) patients who are committed to a state hospital for
17	an examination of competency or to attain competency to stand trial
18	under Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal Procedure, or to receive
19	inpatient mental health services following an acquittal by reason

two groups of patients described by Subsection (a); 1 2 (2) a statewide plan for the separate allocation of 3 funds for the maintenance of beds by the state hospitals for the two groups of patients; and 4 5 (3) a process to adjust the number of beds made available to the two groups of patients based on the success the 6 7 commission has in contracting with private mental health facilities under Sections 533.034 and 533.052. 8 9 (c) In developing a plan under Subsection (a), the commission shall consider: 10 (1) the frequency of use of beds and the historical 11 12 patterns of use of beds in each state hospital by the two groups of patients described by Subsection (a); 13 (2) local needs and demands for beds in each state 14 15 hospital for the two groups of patients; 16 (3) the availability of private mental health 17 facilities with which the commission may contract to provide beds for the two groups of patients; and 18 19 (4) the differences between the two groups of patients described by Subsection (a) with regard to: 20 21 (A) admission to and discharge from a state 22 hospital; (B) rapid stabilization and discharge to the 23 24 community; 25 (C) length of stay in a state hospital; 26 (D) disputes arising from the determination of a

patient's length of stay in a state hospital by a health maintenance

- 2 <u>(E)</u> third-party billing; and
- 3 <u>(F) legal challenges or requirements related to</u>
- 4 the examination and treatment of the group of patients described by

- 6 (d) The commission shall update the plan biennially.
- 7 Sec. 533.052. CONTRACTING WITH PRIVATE MENTAL HEALTH
- 8 FACILITIES TO PROVIDE BEDS FOR CERTAIN PERSONS. The commission
- 9 shall make every effort to contract with private mental health
- 10 facilities to make available a sufficient number of beds, as
- 11 specified in the plan developed by the commission under Section
- 12 533.051, for the group of patients described by Section
- 13 533.051(a)(2) to ensure that a sufficient number of beds in state
- 14 hospitals are available for the group of patients described by
- 15 <u>Section 533.051(a)(1).</u>
- 16 <u>Sec. 533.053. INFORMING COURTS OF COMMITMENT OPTIONS.</u> The
- 17 commission shall develop and implement a procedure through which a
- 18 court that has the authority to commit a person who is incompetent
- 19 to stand trial or who has been acquitted by reason of insanity is
- 20 aware of all of the mental health facilities in which beds are
- 21 available and to which the court may commit the person as provided
- 22 by Chapters 46B and 46C, Code of Criminal Procedure, including
- 23 private mental health facilities that contract with the commission
- 24 under Section 533.052.
- 25 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2013, the executive
- 26 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 27 adopt any rules necessary to implement Section 533.051, Health and

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- 1 Safety Code, as added by this Act, and the rules required by Section
- 2 533.053, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
