3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 316.001, Government Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 316.001. <u>APPROPRIATIONS</u> LIMIT; RATE OF GROWTH. (a)
7	Unless a greater amount is authorized as provided by Section 22(e),
8	Article VIII, Texas Constitution, the amount of appropriations from
9	the state treasury for a fiscal biennium may not exceed the amount
10	determined in accordance with this section.
11	(b) The maximum rate of growth of appropriations from the
12	state treasury for a fiscal biennium, as compared to the preceding
13	fiscal [in a] biennium, is the lesser of the following rates:
14	(1) [from state tax revenues not dedicated by the
15	constitution may not exceed] the estimated rate of growth of
16	<pre>personal income of this [the] state's residents; or</pre>
17	(2) a rate equal to the sum of:
18	(A) the estimated biennial rate of growth of this

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Sec. 316.002. DUTIES OF LEGISLATIVE BUDGET BOARD.

- 1 (a) Before the Legislative Budget Board submits the budget as
- 2 prescribed by Section 322.008(c), the board shall determine
- 3 [establish]:
- 4 (1) the estimated rate of growth of <u>personal income of</u>
- 5 this [the] state's residents [economy] from the current fiscal
- 6 biennium to the next <u>fiscal</u> biennium, determined as provided by
- 7 <u>Subsection (b)</u>;
- 8 (2) <u>a rate equal to the sum of:</u>
- 9 (A) the estimated biennial rate of growth of this
- 10 state's population, determined as provided by Subsection (c); and
- 11 (B) the estimated biennial rate of monetary
- 12 <u>inflation in this state, determined as provided by Subsection (d);</u>
- 13 <u>(3)</u> the <u>amount</u> [level] of appropriations for the
- 14 current fiscal biennium [from state tax revenues not dedicated by
- 15 the constitution]; and
- 16 (4) (4) (4) the maximum permissible amount of
- 17 appropriations of revenue from the state treasury [state tax
- 18 revenues not dedicated by the constitution that could be
- 19 appropriated] for the next fiscal biennium [within the limit
- 20 <u>established</u>] by <u>multiplying the total amount of appropriations for</u>
- 21 the current fiscal biennium by the sum of one and the maximum rate
- 22 of growth of appropriations as provided by Section 316.001 [the
- 23 estimated rate of growth of the state's economy].
- 24 (b) The Legislative Budget Board [Except as provided by
- 25 Subsection (c), the board | shall determine the estimated rate of
- 26 growth of personal income of this [the] state's residents [economy]
- 27 by dividing the estimated Texas total personal income for the next

- 1 <u>fiscal</u> biennium by the estimated Texas total personal income for
- 2 the current fiscal biennium. Using standard statistical methods,
- 3 the board shall make the estimate by projecting through the
- 4 biennium the estimated Texas total personal income reported by the
- 5 United States Department of Commerce or its successor in function.
- 6 (c) The Legislative Budget Board shall determine the
- 7 <u>estimated biennial rate of growth of this state's population</u>
- 8 according to estimates provided by the state demographer. [If a
- 9 more comprehensive definition of the rate of growth of the state's
- 10 economy is developed and is approved by the committee established
- 11 by Section 316.005, the board may use that definition in
- 12 calculating the limit on appropriations.
- 13 (d) The Legislative Budget Board shall determine the
- 14 estimated biennial rate of monetary inflation in this state based
- 15 on the estimated rate of change during the preceding fiscal
- 16 biennium of the effective consumer price index for this state.
- 17 (e) To ensure compliance with Section 22, Article VIII,
- 18 [Section 22, of the] Texas Constitution, the Legislative Budget
- 19 Board may not transmit in any form to the governor or the
- 20 legislature the budget as prescribed by Section 322.008(c) or the
- 21 general appropriations bill as prescribed by Section 322.008(d)
- 22 until the maximum permissible amount [limit on the rate of growth]
- 23 of appropriations for the next fiscal biennium has been adopted as
- 24 required by this subchapter.
- 25 $\underline{\text{(f)}}$ [\(\frac{(e)}{}\)] In the absence of an action by the Legislative
- 26 Budget Board to adopt a maximum permissible amount of
- 27 appropriations for the next fiscal biennium [spending limit] as

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- 1 provided by this section, the maximum permissible amount of
- 2 appropriations for the next fiscal biennium is [in Subsections (a)
- 3 and (b), the estimated rate of growth in the state's economy from
- 4 the current biennium to the next biennium shall be treated as if it
- 5 were zero, and the amount of state tax revenues not dedicated by the
- 6 constitution that could be appropriated within the limit
- 7 established by the estimated rate of growth in the state's economy
- 8 $\frac{\text{shall be}}{\text{shall be}}$ the same as the $\frac{\text{amount}}{\text{amount}}$ [level] of $\frac{\text{those}}{\text{appropriations}}$ for
- 9 the current fiscal biennium, determined under Subsection (a)(3).
- 10 SECTION 3. Section 316.003, Government Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 316.003. PUBLICATION. Before the Legislative Budget
- 13 Board approves the items of information required by Section
- 14 316.002, the board shall publish in the Texas Register the proposed
- 15 items of information and a description of the methodology and
- 16 sources used in the <u>determinations</u> [calculations].
- SECTION 4. Section 316.004, Government Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 316.004. PUBLIC HEARING. Not later than December 1 of
- 20 each even-numbered year, the Legislative Budget Board shall hold a
- 21 public hearing to solicit testimony regarding the proposed items of
- 22 information and the methodology used in making the <u>determinations</u>
- 23 [calculations] required by Section 316.002.
- SECTION 5. Section 316.006, Government Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 316.006. LIMIT ON BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS. Unless
- 27 authorized by majority vote of the members of the board from each

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- 1 house, the Legislative Budget Board budget recommendations
- 2 relating to the proposed appropriations <u>from the state treasury for</u>
- 3 the next fiscal biennium [of state tax revenues not dedicated by the
- 4 constitution] may not exceed the maximum permissible amount of
- 5 $\underline{\text{appropriations}}$ [$\underline{\text{limit}}$] adopted by the committee under Section
- 6 316.005.
- 7 SECTION 6. Section 316.007(a), Government Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The Legislative Budget Board shall include in its budget
- 10 recommendations the proposed <u>maximum permissible amount</u> [limit] of
- 11 appropriations from the state treasury for the next fiscal biennium
- 12 [from state tax revenues not dedicated by the constitution].
- SECTION 7. Section 316.008(a), Government Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (a) Unless the legislature adopts a resolution under
- 16 <u>Section 22(e)</u>, Article VIII, [Section 22(b), of the] Texas
- 17 Constitution, raising the proposed maximum permissible amount of
- 18 [limit on] appropriations for the next fiscal biennium, the
- 19 proposed $\underline{\text{maximum permissible amount}}$ [$\underline{\text{limit}}$] is binding on the
- 20 legislature with respect to all appropriations for the next <u>fiscal</u>
- 21 biennium made from the state treasury [state tax revenues not
- 22 dedicated by the constitution].
- SECTION 8. (a) The changes in law made by this Act apply
- 24 only in relation to appropriations made for the state fiscal
- 25 biennium beginning September 1, 2015, and subsequent state fiscal
- 26 bienniums.
- 27 (b) Appropriations for the state fiscal biennium that

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- 1 begins September 1, 2013, are governed by Subchapter A, Chapter
- 2 316, Government Code, as that subchapter existed immediately before
- 3 the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 4 effect for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect on the date on which the
- 6 constitutional amendment proposed by the 83rd Legislature, Regular
- 7 Session, 2013, regarding the maximum amount of appropriations for a
- 8 state fiscal biennium takes effect. If that amendment is not
- 9 approved by the voters, this Act has no effect.
