A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority of emergency room physicians and certain
- 3 certified emergency medical services professionals to hold a person
- 4 believed to have a mental illness; establishing mental health
- 5 crisis intervention certification for certain emergency medical
- 6 services personnel.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 573.001(d), Health and Safety Code, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 (d) A peace officer who takes a person into custody under
- 11 Subsection (a) shall immediately transport the apprehended person
- 12 to:

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- 13 (1) the nearest appropriate inpatient mental health
- 14 facility; [or]
- 15 (2) a mental health facility deemed suitable by the
- 16 local mental health authority, if an appropriate inpatient mental
- 17 health facility is not available; or
- 18 (3) the nearest emergency room, if the person is in
- 19 need of emergency medical services.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 573, Health and Safety
- 21 Code, is amended by adding Section 573.005 to read as follows:
- Sec. 573.005. EMERGENCY ROOM HOLD ON PERSON. (a) A
- 23 physician who is attending a person at a hospital emergency room or
- 24 an emergency medical services professional certified in mental

- 1 health crisis intervention, as described by Section 773.072, who is
- 2 providing emergency medical services to the person may hold the
- 3 person at the hospital emergency room if the physician or emergency
- 4 medical services professional has reason to believe and does
- 5 believe that the person is mentally ill and that because of that
- 6 mental illness there is a substantial risk of serious harm to the
- 7 person or to others unless the person is immediately restrained.
- 8 The physician or emergency medical services professional may hold
- 9 the person at the hospital emergency room for a period not to exceed
- 10 24 hours pending the arrival of a representative of the local mental
- 11 health authority or a peace officer able to transport the person to
- 12 an inpatient mental health facility for a preliminary examination.
- 13 (b) If at any time the physician or emergency medical
- 14 services professional determines that the person being held no
- 15 longer presents a substantial risk of serious harm to the person or
- 16 to others, the physician or emergency medical services professional
- 17 immediately shall release the person.
- 18 <u>(c) If the physician or emergency medical services</u>
- 19 professional holds or releases the person under this section, the
- 20 physician or emergency medical services professional immediately
- 21 shall notify the local mental health authority of the
- 22 circumstances.
- 23 (d) Section 573.025 and the rights provided by that section
- 24 apply to a person held under this section as if holding the person
- 25 under this section were a detention to which that section applies.
- 26 (e) It is an exception to prosecution under Section 20.02,
- 27 Penal Code, that the restraint of the person was in compliance with

- 1 this section.
- 2 SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 773, Health and Safety
- 3 Code, is amended by adding Section 773.072 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 773.072. MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS INTERVENTION TRAINING
- 5 AND CERTIFICATION. (a) The department by rule may establish
- 6 minimum requirements for the training and testing of certain
- 7 emergency medical services personnel in mental health crisis
- 8 intervention.
- 9 (b) The department may certify an emergency medical
- 10 technician, emergency medical technician--intermediate, emergency
- 11 medical technician--paramedic, or licensed paramedic in mental
- 12 health crisis intervention if the person:
- 13 (1) completes a training course administered by the
- 14 department on mental health issues and persons with mental illness;
- 15 <u>and</u>
- 16 (2) passes an examination administered by the
- 17 department that is designed to test the person's:
- 18 (A) knowledge and recognition of the
- 19 characteristics and symptoms of mental illness; and
- 20 (B) knowledge of mental health crisis
- 21 intervention strategies for persons with mental illness.
- (c) The department may issue a professional achievement or
- 23 proficiency certificate to an emergency medical technician,
- 24 emergency medical technician--intermediate, emergency medical
- 25 technician--paramedic, or licensed paramedic who meets the
- 26 requirements of Subsection (b).
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
