A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to requiring a health credit for high school graduation. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, is amended 4 5 to read as follows: 6 (b-1) The State Board of Education by rule shall require 7 that: except as provided by Subsection (b-2), the 8 (1)9 curriculum requirements for the recommended and advanced high school programs under Subsection (a) include a requirement that 10 11 students successfully complete: 12 (A) four credits in each subject of the 13 foundation curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(1), including at 14 least one-half credit in government and at least one-half credit in economics to meet the social studies requirement; 15 16 (B) for the recommended high school program, two 17 credits in the same language in a language other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A) and, for the advanced high school program, 18 three credits in the same language in a language other than English 19 under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A); and 20 21 (C) for the recommended high school program, 5-1/2 [six] elective credits and, for the advanced high school 22 23 program, 4-1/2 [five] elective credits; 24 (2) one or more credits offered in the required

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1 curriculum for the recommended and advanced high school programs
2 include a research writing component; and

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3 (3) the curriculum requirements for the minimum,
4 recommended, and advanced high school programs under Subsection (a)
5 include a requirement that students successfully complete:

6 (A) one credit in fine arts under Section
7 28.002(a)(2)(D); [and]

8 (B) except as provided by Subsection (b-11), one
9 credit in physical education under Section 28.002(a)(2)(C); and

10 (C) one-half credit in health under Section
11 <u>28.002(a)(2)(B)</u>.

SECTION 2. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to students entering the ninth grade during the 2013-2014 school year or a later school year. For students entering a grade above ninth grade during the 2013-2014 school year, Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as that section existed before amendment by this Act, applies, and that section is continued in effect for that purpose.

19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
