- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- SECTION 1. Sections 11.064(a), (b), and (c), Education 6
- Code, are amended to read as follows: 7
- (a) Each member of the [The] board of trustees of an 8
- independent school district shall [by resolution adopted by 9
- majority vote may require each member of the board to] file the 10
- 11 financial statement required of state officers under Subchapter B,
- 12 Chapter 572, Government Code, with:
- 13 (1) the board of trustees; and
- 14 (2) the Texas Ethics Commission.
- Subchapter B, Chapter 572, Government Code: 15 (b)
- 16 applies to a trustee [subject to this section] as
- if the trustee were a state officer; and 17
- 18 governs the contents, timeliness of filing, and
- public inspection of a statement filed under this section. 19
- (c) A trustee [serving in a school district that has adopted 20
- 21 a resolution under Subsection (a) or that is subject to an order
- issued under Subsection (a-3) commits an offense if the trustee 22
- fails to file the statement required by this section [the 23
- resolution or order]. An offense under this section is a Class B 24

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- 1 misdemeanor.
- 2 SECTION 2. Sections 11.064(a-1), (a-2), (a-3), and (a-4),
- 3 Education Code, are repealed.
- 4 SECTION 3. (a) The changes in law made by this Act to
- 5 Section 11.064, Education Code, apply beginning January 1, 2015. A
- 6 trustee who, before the effective date of this Act, was not required
- 7 to file a financial statement under Section 11.064, Education Code,
- 8 is not required to include financial activity occurring before
- 9 January 1, 2014, in a statement filed under that section.
- 10 (b) The change in law made by this Act applies only to an
- 11 offense committed on or after January 1, 2014. For purposes of this
- 12 section, an offense is committed before January 1, 2014, if any
- 13 element of the offense occurs before that date.
- 14 (c) An offense committed before January 1, 2014, is covered
- 15 by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former
- 16 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect January 1, 2014.
