H.B. No. 384

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the establishment of the Expanded Learning Opportunities Council to study and make recommendations concerning expanded learning opportunities for public school students.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 33, Education Code, is amended by adding Subchapter G to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER G. EXPANDED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES COUNCIL

Sec. 33.251. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "council" means the Expanded Learning Opportunities Council.

Sec. 33.252. EXPANDED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES. (a) Expanded learning opportunities may be provided during:

(1) an extended school day;

(2) an extended school year; or

(3) structured learning programs outside of the regular school day, including before- and after-school programs and summer programs.

(b) Expanded learning opportunities may be provided by offering:

(1) rigorous coursework;

(2) mentoring;

(3) tutoring;

(4) physical activity;

(5) academic support; or

1 (6) educational enrichment in one or more subjects,
2 including fine arts, civic engagement, science, technology,
3 engineering, and mathematics.

4 Sec. 33.253. ESTABLISHMENT; PURPOSES. (a) The Expanded
5 Learning Opportunities Council is established to:

6 (1) study issues concerning expanded learning
7 opportunities for this state's public school students, including:

8 (A) issues related to creating safe places for
9 children outside of the regular school day, improving the academic
10 success of students who participate in expanded learning
11 opportunities programs, and assisting working families; and

12 (B) other issues prescribed under Section
13 33.259; and

14 (2) make recommendations as provided by Section 33.260
15 to address issues studied under this subchapter.

16 (b) In conducting studies under this subchapter, the
17 council shall focus on innovative, hands-on learning approaches
18 that complement rather than replicate the regular school
19 curriculum.

20 Sec. 33.254. SUNSET PROVISION. The council is subject to
21 Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued
22 in existence as provided by that chapter, the council is abolished
23 and this subchapter expires September 1, 2025.

24 Sec. 33.255. COMPOSITION. The council is composed of 10
25 members as follows:

26 (1) two members of the senate, appointed by the
27 lieutenant governor;

1 (2) two members of the house of representatives,
2 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;

3 (3) two members of the public, including one
4 representative of the business community and one parent of a public
5 school student participating in an expanded learning opportunities
6 program in this state, appointed by the governor;

7 (4) two members who are involved in research-based
8 expanded learning opportunities efforts in this state so that at
9 least one is involved in efforts to extend the school day or school
10 year and at least one is involved in efforts to provide an expanded
11 learning opportunities program outside of the regular school day,
12 appointed by the governor;

13 (5) one representative of law enforcement, appointed
14 by the governor; and

15 (6) one member representing the agency, appointed by
16 the commissioner.

17 Sec. 33.256. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Members of the council
18 serve two-year terms, with the terms expiring February 1 of each
19 odd-numbered year.

20 (b) A member of the council may be reappointed.

21 (c) A vacancy on the council shall be filled for the
22 remainder of the unexpired term in the manner as the appointment for
23 that position is made under Section 33.255.

24 (d) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of
25 representatives shall appoint the presiding officer of the council
26 on an alternating basis. The presiding officer shall serve a
27 two-year term expiring on February 1 of each odd-numbered year. A

1 vacancy in the office of presiding officer shall be filled for the
2 remainder of the unexpired term by the lieutenant governor or
3 speaker, whichever official appointed the most recent presiding
4 officer.

5 Sec. 33.257. MEETINGS. (a) The council shall meet in
6 person at least three times each year and may hold additional
7 meetings by conference call if necessary.

8 (b) Section 551.125, Government Code, applies to a meeting
9 held by conference call under this section, except that Section
10 551.125(b), Government Code, does not apply.

11 Sec. 33.258. COMPENSATION. A member of the council may not
12 receive compensation for service on the council.

13 Sec. 33.259. POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The council shall:

14 (1) study issues related to expanded learning
15 opportunities for public school students;

16 (2) study current research and best practices related
17 to meaningful expanded learning opportunities;

18 (3) analyze the availability of and unmet needs for
19 state and local programs for expanded learning opportunities for
20 public school students;

21 (4) analyze opportunities to create incentives for
22 businesses to support expanded learning opportunities programs for
23 public school students;

24 (5) analyze opportunities to maximize charitable
25 support for public and private partnerships for expanded learning
26 opportunities programs for public school students;

27 (6) analyze opportunities to promote science,

1 technology, engineering, and mathematics in expanded learning
2 opportunities programs for public school students; and

3 (7) perform other duties consistent with this
4 subchapter.

5 (b) In carrying out its powers and duties under this
6 section, the council may request reports and other information
7 relating to expanded learning opportunities and students in
8 expanded learning opportunities programs from the Texas Education
9 Agency and any other state agency.

10 Sec. 33.260. STATEWIDE EXPANDED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES
11 PLAN; REPORT. (a) The council shall develop a comprehensive
12 statewide action plan for the improvement of expanded learning
13 opportunities for public school students in this state, including a
14 timeline for implementation of the plan.

15 (b) The council shall submit to both houses of the
16 legislature, the governor, and the agency on or before November 1 of
17 each even-numbered year a written report concerning:

18 (1) the status of the development or implementation of
19 the council's statewide action plan, as applicable;

20 (2) any action taken to further development or
21 implementation of the plan;

22 (3) any area that needs improvement in implementing
23 the plan;

24 (4) any recommended change to the plan; and

25 (5) programs and services that address expanded
26 learning opportunities outside of the regular school day.

27 Sec. 33.261. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The agency may

1 accept on behalf of the council a gift, grant, or donation from any
2 source to carry out the purposes of this subchapter.

3 SECTION 2. (a) The Expanded Learning Opportunities Council
4 shall submit the initial report required under Subchapter G,
5 Chapter 33, Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than
6 November 1, 2016.

7 (b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
8 Act, the designated officials shall appoint the members of the
9 Expanded Learning Opportunities Council under Subchapter G,
10 Chapter 33, Education Code, as added by this Act.

11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
15 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
