## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a medal for certain members of the state military forces
3 who served during the Cold War; authorizing a fee.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 431.134, Government Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as 7 follows:

8 (a) The adjutant general may adopt rules and regulations 9 relating to the:

10 (1) Texas Faithful Service Medal, which shall be 11 awarded to a member of the state military forces who has completed 12 five years of honorable service during which the person has shown 13 fidelity to duty, efficient service, and great loyalty to the 14 state;

15 (2) Federal Service Medal, which shall be awarded to a 16 person who was inducted into federal service from the state 17 military forces between June 15, 1940, and January 1, 1946, or after 18 June 1, 1950, if the service was for more than 90 days;

19 (3) Texas Medal of Merit, which may be presented to a
20 member of the military forces of this state, another state, or the
21 United States who performs outstanding service or attains
22 extraordinary achievement in behalf of the state or United States;

(4) Texas Outstanding Service Medal, which may be
 presented to a member of the military forces of this state, another

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state, or the United States who has performed service in a superior
 and clearly outstanding manner;

3 (5) Texas State Guard Service Medal, which shall be 4 awarded to a person who completes three consecutive years of 5 honorable service in the Texas State Guard during which the person 6 has shown fidelity to duty, efficient service, and great loyalty to 7 the state;

8 (6) Texas Desert Shield/Desert Storm Campaign Medal, 9 which shall be awarded to a person who was inducted into federal 10 service from the Texas National Guard after August 1, 1990, in 11 support of Operation Desert Shield or Operation Desert Storm, 12 without regard to the place that the person was deployed while 13 serving on active federal military duty;

14 (7) Texas Humanitarian Service Medal, which shall be15 awarded to a person who:

16 (A) does not meet the criteria for an award of the17 federal Humanitarian Service Medal;

(B) is a member of the state military forces; and (C) while serving on state active duty or active duty under state authority in accordance with Title 32 of the United States Code, participates satisfactorily in defense support to a mission under civilian authority to protect life or property during or soon after a natural disaster or civil unrest in the state;

24 (8) Texas Cavalry Medal, which shall be awarded to a25 person who:

26 (A) served on or after September 11, 2001, in the
27 124th Cavalry, Texas Army National Guard; and

No. 402 1 (B) served in a hostile fire zone as designated 2 by the United States secretary of defense; 3 (9) Texas Combat Service Ribbon, which shall be awarded to a member of the Texas National Guard who served, after 4 5 September 11, 2001, in a hostile fire zone as designated by the United States secretary of defense; 6 Texas Purple Heart Medal, which shall be awarded 7 (10)8 to a person who, after September 11, 2001: 9 (A) was inducted into federal service from the Texas National Guard; and 10 (B) meets the criteria for an award of the 11 12 federal Purple Heart Medal; Texas Superior Service Medal, which shall be 13 (11)14 awarded to: 15 (A) a member of the state military forces who 16 has: 17 (i) completed 30 or more years of honorable state service or a combination of state and federal service; and 18 19 (ii) continually demonstrated superior performance and service while assigned to key leadership positions 20 demanding responsibility; or 21 22 a civilian who has contributed significant (B) 23 service to the state military forces; 24 (12)Texas Homeland Defense Service Medal, which shall 25 be awarded to a member of the state military forces who served: 26 (A) on or after September 11, 2001; 27 (B) on state active duty or active duty under

No. 402 1 state authority in accordance with Title 32 of the United States Code; and 2 3 (C) satisfactorily in defense support to а mission in the state under civilian authority; 4 5 (13) Texas Iraqi Campaign Medal, which shall be awarded to a person who was inducted into federal service from the 6 Texas National Guard, without regard to the place that the person 7 8 was deployed while serving on active federal military duty, after: 9 March 19, 2003, in support of Operation Iraqi (A) 10 Freedom; or August 31, 2010, in support of Operation New 11 (B) 12 Dawn; [and] Texas Afghanistan Campaign Medal, which shall be 13 (14)14 awarded to a person who was inducted into federal service from the 15 Texas National Guard after October 6, 2001, in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, without regard to the place that the person was 16 17 deployed while serving on active federal military duty; and (15) Cold War Medal, which shall be awarded to a member 18 19 of the Texas National Guard or the Texas State Guard who served between September 2, 1945, and December 26, 1991, subject to 20 Subsection (c). 21 (c) A person described by Subsection (a)(15) may be awarded 22 a Cold War Medal only if a fee in the amount necessary to cover the 23 costs of awarding the medal is paid to the adjutant general's 24 25 department. 26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
