Sections 521.242(a), (b), and (e), Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) A person whose license has been suspended for a cause other than a physical or mental disability or impairment or a 8 conviction under Section 49.04, Penal Code, may apply for an 9 occupational license by filing a verified petition with the clerk 10 of a justice, municipal, [the] county, [court] or district court 11 12 with jurisdiction that includes [in] the precinct or municipality [county] in which: 13 14 (1) the person resides; or 15 (2) the offense occurred for which the license was 16 suspended. A person may apply for an occupational license by filing 17 (b) a verified petition only with the clerk of the [county court or 18 district] court in which the person was convicted if: 19 20 (1) the person's license has been automatically 21 suspended or canceled under this chapter for a conviction of an 22 offense under the laws of this state; and 23 (2) the person has not been issued, in the 10 years 24 preceding the date of the filing of the petition, more than one

1 occupational license after a conviction under the laws of this

3 (e) The clerk of the court shall file the petition as in any
4 other [civil] matter.

5 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 6 to an occupational driver's license that is applied for on or after 7 the effective date of this Act. An occupational driver's license 8 applied for before the effective date of this Act is covered by the 9 law in effect on the date the application was filed, and the former 10 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
