- 13 Sec. 470.002. DESIGNATION OF STATE CLIMATOLOGIST. (a) The

- (b) To be eligible for designation as the state 17

- 2 Sec. 470.003. STATE CLIMATE OFFICE. The state
- 3 <u>climatologist</u> shall operate a state climate office that meets or
- 4 <u>exceeds the standards and level of service required for recognition</u>
- 5 by the American Association of State Climatologists or an
- 6 appropriate successor organization.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
