A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to state control of teacher appraisal criteria, curriculum
3	standards, and assessment instruments.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 21.351(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) The commissioner shall adopt a recommended appraisal
8	process and criteria on which to appraise the performance of
9	teachers. The commissioner may not adopt or develop a recommended
10	appraisal process and criteria based on any appraisal criteria that
11	incorporate the results of student performance on assessment
12	instruments that are intended for national applicability or are
13	enacted federally as optional criteria, excluding college advanced
14	placement tests and international baccalaureate examinations as
15	those terms are defined by Section 28.051. The criteria must be
16	based on observable, job-related behavior, including:
17	(1) teachers' implementation of discipline management
18	procedures; and
19	(2) the performance of teachers' students.
20	SECTION 2. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by
21	adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), (b-3), and (b-4) to read as
22	follows:
23	(b-1) In this section, "common core state standards" means
24	the national curriculum standards developed by the Common Core

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1 State Standards Initiative.

2 (b-2) The State Board of Education may not adopt common core
3 state standards to comply with a duty imposed under this chapter.
4 (b-3) A school district may not use common core state
5 standards to comply with the requirement to provide instruction in

6 <u>the essential knowledge and skills at appropriate grade levels</u> 7 under Subsection (c).

8 (b-4) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, a 9 school district or open-enrollment charter school may not be 10 required to offer any aspect of a common core state standards 11 curriculum.

SECTION 3. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsection (a-3) to read as follows:

14 <u>(a-3) The agency may not adopt or develop a</u> 15 <u>criterion-referenced assessment instrument under this section</u> 16 <u>based on common core state standards as defined by Section</u> 17 <u>28.002(b-1). This subsection does not prohibit the use of college</u> 18 <u>advanced placement tests or international baccalaureate</u> 19 <u>examinations as those terms are defined by Section 28.051.</u>

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
