14	(c) An employee shall give reasonable advance notice of the
15	employee's intention to use the sick leave to attend <u>an educational</u>
16	<pre>activity [a parent=teacher conference].</pre>
17	(d) In this section:
18	(1) <u>"Educational activity" means a school-sponsored</u>
19	activity, including a parent-teacher conference, tutoring, a
20	volunteer program, a field trip, a classroom program, a school
21	committee meeting, an academic competition, and an athletic, music,
22	or theater program.
23	(2) "Employee" has the meaning assigned by Section
24	661.001.

H.B. No. 480 1 <u>(3)</u> [(2)] "Parent" means a person standing in parental 2 relation.

3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
