9 (r) As a specific exception to Subsection (c)(2), (3), or (4), a law enforcement agency may transfer not more than 10 percent 10 of the gross amount credited to the agency's fund to a separate 11 special fund established in the treasury of the political 12 subdivision or maintained by the state law enforcement agency, as 13

applicable. The law enforcement agency shall administer the

separate special fund. Interest received from the investment of 15

money in the fund shall be credited to the fund. The agency may use 16

money in the fund only to provide scholarships to children of peace 17

officers who were employed by the agency or by another law 18

19 enforcement agency with which the agency has overlapping geographic

jurisdiction and who were killed in the line of duty. Scholarships 20

- 5 (s) Not later than June 1 of each year, the attorney general
- 6 shall develop a report based on information submitted by law
- 7 enforcement agencies and attorneys representing the state under
- 8 Subsection (g) detailing the total amount of funds forfeited, or
- 9 credited after the sale of forfeited property, in this state in the
- 10 preceding calendar year. The attorney general shall maintain in a
- 11 prominent location on the attorney general's publicly accessible
- 12 Internet website a link to the most recent annual report developed
- 13 under this subsection.
