A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the use of proceeds from criminal asset forfeiture to

3 provide college scholarships to children of peace officers killed

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Article 59.06, Code of Criminal Procedure, is

amended by adding Subsections (r) and (s) to read as follows:

9 (r) As a specific exception to Subsection (c)(2), (3), or

10 (4), a law enforcement agency may transfer not more than 10 percent

11 of the gross amount credited to the agency's fund to a separate

12 special fund in the treasury of the political subdivision or state

13 <u>law enforcement agency</u>, as applicable. The law enforcement agency

14 shall administer the separate special fund. Interest received from

15 the investment of money in the fund shall be credited to the fund.

16 The agency may use money in the fund only to provide scholarships to

17 children of peace officers who were employed by the agency or by

18 another law enforcement agency with which the agency has

19 overlapping geographic jurisdiction and who were killed in the line

20 of duty. Scholarships under this subsection may be used only to pay

21 the costs of attendance at an institution of higher education or

22 private or independent institution of higher education, including

23 tuition and fees and costs for housing, books, supplies,

24 transportation, and other related personal expenses. In this

- 2 independent institution of higher education" have the meanings
- 3 assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code.
- 4 (s) Not later than June 1 of each year, the attorney general
- 5 shall develop a report detailing the total value of forfeited
- 6 property in this state in the preceding calendar year, as specified
- 7 according to the law enforcement agency seizing the property. The
- 8 attorney general shall maintain in a prominent location on the
- 9 attorney general's publicly accessible Internet website a link to
- 10 the most recent annual report developed under this subsection.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
