## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the regulation of the practice of dentistry and oral and

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 151.052(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) This subtitle does not apply to:
- 8 (1) a dentist, licensed under the laws of this state,
- 9 engaged strictly in the practice of dentistry, including the
- 10 practice of the dental specialty of oral and maxillofacial surgery
- 11 as described by Section 251.003(c), regardless of whether the
- 12 dentist is also a licensed physician;
- 13 (2) a licensed optometrist or therapeutic optometrist
- 14 engaged strictly in the practice of optometry or therapeutic
- 15 optometry as defined by law;
- 16 (3) a licensed chiropractor engaged strictly in the
- 17 practice of chiropractic as defined by law;
- 18 (4) a registered nurse or licensed vocational nurse
- 19 engaged strictly in the practice of nursing in accordance with the
- 20 applicable licensing acts and other laws of this state;
- 21 (5) a licensed podiatrist engaged strictly in the
- 22 practice of podiatry as defined by law;
- 23 (6) a licensed or certified psychologist engaged
- 24 strictly in the practice of psychology as defined by law;

- 1 (7) a licensed physical therapist engaged strictly in
- 2 the practice of physical therapy in accordance with the law
- 3 relating to physical therapy practice;
- 4 (8) a commissioned or contract surgeon in the United
- 5 States uniformed services or Public Health Service in the
- 6 performance of that person's duties if the person is not engaged in
- 7 private practice;
- 8 (9) a person who furnishes medical assistance in an
- 9 emergency or disaster situation if no charge is made for the medical
- 10 assistance;
- 11 (10) a student in training in a board-approved medical
- 12 school while performing, under the supervision of a licensed
- 13 practitioner, the duties assigned in the course of training;
- 14 (11) a legally qualified physician of another state
- 15 who is in this state for consultation with a physician licensed in
- 16 this state but who does not:
- 17 (A) maintain an office in this state; or
- 18 (B) appoint a place in this state for seeing,
- 19 examining, or treating a patient; or
- 20 (12) any other activity that the board designates as
- 21 exempt from the application of this subtitle.
- 22 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 23 151.052(a), Occupations Code, applies only to an act or omission in
- 24 the practice of dentistry, including oral and maxillofacial
- 25 surgery, occurring on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 26 act or omission occurring before the effective date of this Act is
- 27 governed by the law in effect on the date the act or omission

- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
