## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to the vaccination against bacterial meningitis of 3 entering students at public and private or independent institutions 4 of higher education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 51.9192, Education Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d-2) to read as 8 follows:

9 (b) This section applies only to an entering student at an 10 institution of higher education or private or independent 11 institution of higher education. This section does not apply to a 12 student of an institution who is enrolled only in online or other 13 distance education courses or who is <u>22</u> [<del>30</del>] years of age or older. 14 For purposes of this subsection, "entering student" includes:

a new student, as defined by Section 51.9191; and

16 (2) a student who previously attended an institution 17 of higher education or private or independent institution of higher 18 education before January 1, 2012, and who is enrolling in the same 19 or another institution of higher education or private or 20 independent institution of higher education following a break in 21 enrollment of at least one fall or spring semester.

22 (d-2) An affidavit submitted under Subsection (d)(2) must
23 be:

(1) on a form described by Section 161.0041, Health

1 and Safety Code; and

2 (2) submitted to the appropriate admitting official 3 not later than the 90th day after the date the affidavit is 4 notarized.

5 SECTION 2. Section 161.0041(a), Health and Safety Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 (a) A person claiming an exemption from a required
8 immunization based on reasons of conscience, including a religious
9 belief, under Section 161.004 of this code, Section 38.001,
10 <u>51.9192</u>, or 51.933, Education Code, or Section 42.043, Human
11 Resources Code, must complete an affidavit on a form provided by the
12 department stating the reason for the exemption.

13 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply 14 beginning with entering students enrolling in public or private or 15 independent institutions of higher education in this state on or 16 after January 1, 2014.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect October 1, 2013.
