## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study on the stringency of state environmental

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "commission" means the
- 6 Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.
- 7 SECTION 2. ENVIRONMENTAL STANDARDS STUDY. (a) The
- 8 commission shall conduct a study of state environmental statutes
- 9 and state agency rules to determine which statutes and rules
- 10 provide standards or requirements more stringent than the minimum
- 11 acceptable standards or requirements provided by the applicable
- 12 federal laws or regulations adopted by federal agencies to regulate
- 13 the same activity.
- 14 (b) The study must include recommendations for establishing
- 15 by state statute or state agency rules state environmental
- 16 standards or requirements that are not more stringent than the
- 17 minimum acceptable standards or requirements provided by the
- 18 applicable federal laws or regulations adopted by federal agencies
- 19 to regulate the same activity.
- 20 (c) The commission may work with other state agencies,
- 21 institutions of higher education, nonprofit organizations, private
- 22 organizations, or business entities to conduct the study.
- SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than January 1, 2015, the
- 24 commission shall submit a report on the results and recommendations

- 1 of the study to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker
- 2 of the house of representatives, and the presiding officer of each
- 3 standing committee of the legislature with jurisdiction over
- 4 environmental matters.
- 5 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act expires August 31,
- 6 2015.
- 7 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 8 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 9 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 10 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 11 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
