A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to continuing education requirements for certain 3 educators. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 21.054, Education Code, is amended by 5 adding Subsections (d), (e), and (f) to read as follows: 6 7 (d) Continuing education requirements for a classroom teacher must provide that not more than 25 percent of the training 8 9 required every five years include instruction regarding: (1) collecting and analyzing information that will 10 11 improve effectiveness in the classroom; 12 (2) recognizing early warning indicators that a student may be at risk of dropping out of school; 13 14 (3) integrating technology into classroom 15 instruction; (4) educating diverse student populations, including: 16 (A) students with disabilities, including mental 17 health disorders; 18 19 (B) students who are educationally 20 disadvantaged; 21 (C) students of limited English proficiency; and 22 (D) students at risk of dropping out of school; 23 and 24 (5) increasing knowledge of the subject area taught by

No. 642 1 the educator. 2 (e) Continuing education requirements for a principal must provide that not more than 25 percent of the training required every 3 five years include instruction regarding: 4 5 (1) effective and efficient management, including: 6 (A) collecting and analyzing information; 7 (B) making decisions and managing time; and 8 (C) supervising student discipline and managing behavior; 9 (2) recognizing early warning indicators that a 10 student may be at risk of dropping out of school; 11 12 (3) integrating technology into campus curriculum and 13 instruction; 14 (4) educating diverse student populations, including: 15 (A) students with disabilities, including mental health disorders; 16 17 (B) students are educationally who 18 disadvantaged; 19 (C) students of limited English proficiency; and 20 (D) students at risk of dropping out of school; and 21 22 (5) providing instructional leadership, including: 23 (A) providing teacher support; 24 (B) maintaining community involvement; 25 (C) building professional learning communities; 26 and 27 (D) recruiting, coaching, remediating, and

2	(f) Continuing education requirements for a counselor must
3	provide that not more than 25 percent of training required every
4	five years include instruction regarding:
5	(1) assisting students in developing high school
6	graduation plans;
7	(2) implementing dropout prevention strategies; and
8	(3) informing students concerning:
9	(A) college admissions, including college
10	financial aid resources and application procedures; and
11	(B) career opportunities.
12	SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2014, the State Board
13	for Educator Certification shall propose rules implementing
14	Section 21.054, Education Code, as amended by this Act.
15	SECTION 3. An educator subject to continuing education
16	requirements immediately before the effective date of this Act is
17	not required to comply with the continuing education requirements
18	described by Section 21.054(d), (e), or (f), Education Code, as
19	added by this Act, for any continuing education requirements period
20	that ends before January 1, 2017.
21	SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2014-2015
22	school year.
23	SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
