4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 21.054, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsections (d), (e), and (f) to read as follows:
7	(d) Continuing education requirements for a classroom
8	teacher must provide that not more than 25 percent of the training
9	required every five years include instruction regarding:
10	(1) collecting and analyzing information that will
11	improve effectiveness in the classroom;
12	(2) recognizing early warning indicators that a
13	student may be at risk of dropping out of school;
14	(3) integrating technology into classroom
15	instruction; and
16	(4) educating diverse student populations, including:
17	(A) students with disabilities, including mental
18	health disorders;
19	(B) students who are educationally
20	disadvantaged;
21	(C) students of limited English proficiency; and
22	(D) students at risk of dropping out of school.
23	(e) Continuing education requirements for a principal must
24	provide that not more than 25 percent of the training required every

1 five years include instruction regarding: 2 (1) effective and efficient management, including: 3 (A) collecting and analyzing information; (B) making decisions and managing time; and 4 5 (C) supervising student discipline and managing 6 behavior; 7 (2) recognizing early warning indicators that a 8 student may be at risk of dropping out of school; 9 (3) integrating technology into campus curriculum and 10 instruction; and (4) educating diverse student populations, including: 11 12 (A) students with disabilities, including mental health disorders; 13 14 (B) students who are educationally 15 disadvantaged; 16 (C) students of limited English proficiency; and 17 (D) students at risk of dropping out of school. (f) Continuing education requirements for a counselor must 18 19 provide that not more than 25 percent of training required every five years include instruction regarding: 20 21 (1) assisting students in developing high school 22 graduation plans; 23 (2) implementing dropout prevention strategies; and 24 (3) informing students concerning: (A) college admissions, including college 25 26 financial aid resources and application procedures; and (B) career opportunities. 27

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SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2014, the State Board
for Educator Certification shall propose rules implementing
Section 21.054, Education Code, as amended by this Act.

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4 SECTION 3. An educator subject to continuing education 5 requirements immediately before the effective date of this Act is 6 not required to comply with the continuing education requirements 7 described by Section 21.054(d), (e), or (f), Education Code, as 8 added by this Act, for any continuing education requirements period 9 that ends before January 1, 2017.

SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2014-2015 school year.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
