5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 54.201 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 54.201. COMMON REQUIREMENTS APPLICABLE TO WAIVERS,
8	EXEMPTIONS, AND OTHER TUITION OR FEE BENEFITS. (a) This section
9	applies to any waiver, exemption, or other tuition or fee benefit
10	provided by this subchapter or other law. This section applies
11	notwithstanding conflicting requirements of other law, except that
12	additional or stricter requirements provided by a specific statute
13	apply in addition to the minimum requirements provided by this
14	section.
15	(b) To be eligible for a waiver, exemption, or other tuition
16	or fee benefit, a person must:
17	(1) first exhaust any available federal grant,
18	scholarship, or financial aid other than a loan; and
19	(2) make satisfactory academic progress toward a
20	degree or certificate at the institution, as determined by the
21	institution.
22	(c) A waiver, exemption, or other tuition or fee benefit
23	does not apply to a graduate or continuing education program that is
24	self-funded.

(d) A waiver, exemption, or other tuition or fee benefit applies to a maximum of eight semesters.

3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 the vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
