A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to state assessment instruments administered in public

3 schools.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 28.014(c) and (f), Education Code, are

6 amended to read as follows:

- 7 (c) The agency, in consultation with the Texas Higher
- 8 Education Coordinating Board, shall adopt an end-of-course
- 9 assessment instrument for each course developed under this section
- 10 to ensure the rigor of the course. A school district shall, in
- 11 accordance with State Board of Education rules, administer the
- 12 end-of-course assessment instrument to a student enrolled in a
- 13 course developed under this section. Each school district shall
- 14 adopt a policy that requires a student's performance on the
- 15 end-of-course assessment instrument to account for 15 percent of
- 16 the student's <u>second semester</u> [<u>final</u>] grade for the course <u>in</u>
- 17 accordance with commissioner rule adopted under Section
- 18 <u>39.023(c-7)</u>. [A student's performance on an end-of-course
- 19 assessment instrument administered under this subsection may be
- 20 used, on a scale of 0-40, in calculating whether the student
- 21 satisfies the graduation requirements established under Section
- 22 39.025.
- 23 (f) To the extent applicable, the commissioner shall draw
- 24 from curricula and instructional materials developed under Section

- [Sections] 28.008 [and 61.0763] in developing a course and related 1 instructional materials under this section. Not later than 2 September 1, 2010, the State Board of Education shall adopt 3 essential knowledge and skills for each course developed under this 4 5 section. The State Board of Education shall make each course developed under this section and the related instructional 6 materials available to school districts not later than the 7 8 2014-2015 school year. [As required by Subsection (c), a school district shall adopt a policy requiring a student's performance on 9 10 an end-of-course assessment instrument administered under that subsection to account for 15 percent of the student's grade for a 11 course developed under this section not later than the 2014-2015 12 school year.] This subsection expires September 1, 2015. 13
- SECTION 2. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsections (c), (c-3), (e), and (h) and adding Subsection (c-7) to read as follows:
- 17 The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment instruments for secondary-level courses in Algebra I, Algebra II, 18 geometry, biology, chemistry, physics, English I, English II, 19 English III, world geography, world history, and United States 20 history. The Algebra I, Algebra II, and geometry end-of-course 21 assessment instruments must be administered with the aid of 22 technology. A school district shall comply with State Board of 23 24 Education rules regarding administration of the assessment instruments listed in this subsection and shall adopt a policy that 25 requires a student's performance on an end-of-course assessment 26 instrument for a course listed in this subsection in which the 27

- 1 student is enrolled to account for 15 percent of the student's second semester [final] grade for the course. If a student retakes 2 3 an end-of-course assessment instrument for a course listed in this subsection, as provided by Section 39.025, a school district is not 4 5 required to use the student's performance on the subsequent administration or administrations of the assessment instrument to 6 determine the student's [final] grade for the course. If a student 7 8 is in a special education program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and dismissal committee shall 9 10 determine whether any allowable modification is necessary in administering to the student an assessment instrument required 11 12 under this subsection. The State Board of Education shall administer the assessment instruments. The State Board of 13 14 Education shall adopt a schedule for the administration of 15 end-of-course assessment instruments that complies with the requirements of Subsection (c-3). 16
- 17 (c-3) In adopting a schedule for the administration of 18 assessment instruments under this section, the State Board of 19 Education shall require:
- 20 (1) assessment instruments administered under 21 Subsection (a) to be administered on a schedule so that the first 22 assessment instrument is administered at least two weeks later than 23 the date on which the first assessment instrument was administered 24 under Subsection (a) during the 2006-2007 school year; and
- (2) the spring administration of end-of-course assessment instruments under Subsection (c) to occur in each school district during the final [not earlier than the first full] week of

- 1 the school year [in May], except that the spring administration of
- 2 the end-of-course assessment instruments in English I Writing,
- 3 English II Writing, and English III Writing must be permitted to
- 4 occur at an earlier date.
- 5 (c-7) The commissioner by rule shall:
- 6 (1) adopt a statewide standardized procedure to
- 7 convert and use end-of-course assessment instrument performance
- 8 for purposes of determining course grades in a manner that provides
- 9 uniformity across school districts throughout this state; and
- 10 (2) require each school district to use the procedure
- 11 adopted under Subdivision (1) in determining second semester course
- 12 grades as provided by Subsection (c) and Section 28.014(c).
- (e) Under rules adopted by the State Board of Education,
- 14 each [every third] year, the agency shall release the questions and
- 15 answer keys to each assessment instrument administered under
- 16 Subsection (a), (b), (c), (d), or (1), excluding any assessment
- 17 instrument administered to a student for the purpose of retaking
- 18 the assessment instrument, after the last time the instrument is
- 19 administered for that school year. To ensure a valid bank of
- 20 questions for use each year, the agency is not required to release a
- 21 question that is being field-tested and was not used to compute the
- 22 student's score on the instrument. The agency shall also release,
- 23 under board rule, each question that is no longer being
- 24 field-tested and that was not used to compute a student's score.
- 25 (h) The agency shall notify school districts and campuses of
- 26 the results of assessment instruments administered under this
- 27 section [at the earliest possible date determined by the State

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- 1 Board of Education but of later than the 21st day after the date
- 2 the assessment instrument is administered [beginning of the
- 3 subsequent school year].
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 39.0234, Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 39.0234. ADMINISTRATION OF ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS BY
- 7 COMPUTER. (a) The agency shall ensure that assessment instruments
- 8 required under Section 39.023 are capable of being administered by
- 9 computer. Except as provided by Subsection (b), the [The]
- 10 commissioner may not require a school district or open-enrollment
- 11 charter school to administer an assessment instrument by computer.
- 12 (b) A school district, including a disciplinary alternative
- 13 education program provided by the district, or a juvenile justice
- 14 alternative education program shall provide to a student eligible
- 15 to retake an end-of-course assessment instrument the opportunity to
- 16 <u>retake that assessment instrument by computer at any reasonable</u>
- 17 time. The commissioner may adopt rules as necessary to administer
- 18 this subsection.
- 19 SECTION 4. Sections 39.025(a), (a-1), (a-2), (a-3), (b),
- 20 (b-2), and (e), Education Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 21 (a) The commissioner shall adopt rules requiring a student
- 22 participating in the recommended or advanced high school program to
- 23 be administered each end-of-course assessment instrument listed in
- 24 Section 39.023(c) and requiring a student participating in the
- 25 minimum high school program to be administered an end-of-course
- 26 assessment instrument listed in Section 39.023(c) only for a course
- 27 in which the student is enrolled and for which an end-of-course

assessment instrument is administered. [A student is required to achieve, in each subject in the foundation curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(1), a cumulative score that is at least equal to the product of the number of end-of-course assessment instruments administered to the student in that subject and a scale score that indicates satisfactory performance, as determined by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a). A student must achieve a minimum score as determined by the commissioner to be within a reasonable range of the scale score under Section 39.0241(a) on an end-of-course assessment instrument for the score to count towards the student's cumulative score. For purposes of this subsection, a student's cumulative score is determined using the student's highest score on each end-of-course assessment instrument administered to the student. A student may not receive a high school diploma until the student has performed satisfactorily on the end-of-course assessment instruments in the manner provided under this subsection. This subsection does not require a student to demonstrate readiness to enroll in an institution of higher education. 19

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(a-1) The commissioner by rule shall determine a method by which a student's satisfactory performance on an advanced placement test, an international baccalaureate examination, an SAT Subject Test, or another assessment instrument determined commissioner to be at least as rigorous as an end-of-course assessment instrument adopted under Section 39.023(c) may be used as a factor in determining whether the student satisfies the requirements of Subsection (a) and Subsection (a-2) or (a-3), as

- applicable to the student[, including the cumulative score 1 requirement of that subsection]. The commissioner by rule may 2 3 determine a method by which a student's satisfactory performance on a Preliminary Scholastic Assessment Test (PSAT) assessment or a 4 preliminary American College Test (ACT) assessment may be used as a 5 determining whether the student satisfies the 6 in requirements of Subsection (a) and Subsection (a-2) or (a-3), as 7 8 applicable to the student.
- 9 (a-2) A [In addition to the cumulative score requirements
 10 under Subsection (a), a] student must achieve a score that meets or
 11 exceeds the score determined by the commissioner under Section
 12 39.0241(a) on [for] English II [III] and Algebra I [III]
 13 end-of-course assessment instruments to graduate under the minimum
 14 or recommended high school program.
- 15 (a-3) A [In addition to the cumulative score requirements
 16 under Subsection (a), a] student must achieve a score that meets or
 17 exceeds the score determined by the commissioner under Section
 18 39.0241(a-1) on English II [III] and Algebra I [II] end-of-course
 19 assessment instruments in order to graduate under the advanced high
 20 school program.
- (b) Each time an end-of-course assessment instrument is administered, a student who failed to achieve the [a minimum] score requirement under Subsection (a-2) or (a-3) may [Subsection (a) shall] retake the assessment instrument. [A student who fails to perform satisfactorily on an Algebra II or English III end-of-course assessment instrument under the college readiness performance standard, as provided under Section 39.024(b), may

1 retake the assessment instrument. Any other student may retake an

2 end-of-course assessment instrument for any reason. A student is

3 not required to retake a course as a condition of retaking an

4 end-of-course assessment instrument.

- 5 (b-2) If a school district determines that a student, on completion of grade 11, is unlikely to achieve the [cumulative] 6 score requirement under this section [requirements] for one or more 7 8 end-of-course assessment instruments as necessary prescribed by Subsection (a) for receiving a high school diploma, 9 10 the district shall require the student to enroll in a corresponding content-area college preparatory course for which an end-of-course 11 12 assessment instrument has been adopted, if available. A student who enrolls in a college preparatory course described by this 13 14 subsection shall be administered an end-of-course assessment 15 instrument for the course, with the end-of-course assessment 16 instrument scored on a scale as determined by the commissioner [not 17 to exceed 20 percent of the cumulative score requirements required to graduate as determined under Subsection (a)]. A student may use 18 19 the student's score on the end-of-course assessment instrument for 20 the college preparatory course towards satisfying the [cumulative] score requirement under this section [requirements prescribed by 21 Subsection (a)]. 22
- (e) The commissioner shall establish a required performance level for an assessment instrument adopted under Subsection (d) that is at least as rigorous as the performance level required to be met under Subsection (a-2) or (a-3), as applicable to the student [(a)].

- 1 SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2014, the commissioner
- 2 of education shall by rule adopt a statewide standardized procedure
- 3 for converting and using end-of-course assessment instrument
- 4 performance for purposes of determining course grades as provided
- 5 by Section 28.014(c), Education Code, as amended by this Act, and
- 6 Section 39.023(c-7), Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 6. (a) This Act applies beginning with the
- 8 2013-2014 school year.
- 9 (b) Section 39.025, Education Code, as amended by this Act,
- 10 applies only to students who have entered or will enter the ninth
- 11 grade during the 2011-2012 school year or a later school year.
- 12 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
