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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the provision of scholarships, bonuses, and wage supplementation to certain child-care workers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 302.006, Labor Code, is amended to read 5 as follows: 6 Sec. 302.006. PROFESSIONAL 7 CHILD-CARE TRAINING SCHOLARSHIPS, BONUSES, AND WAGE SUPPLEMENTATION. (a) 8 In this 9 section: (1) "Child-care facility" has the meaning assigned by 10 11 Section 42.002, Human Resources Code. 12 (2) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code. 13 14 (a-1) The commission shall [may] develop and administer a program under which the commission awards scholarships to eligible 15 child-care workers [in the amount of \$1,000 each for professional 16 child-care training to eligible recipients]. 17 18 (b) A recipient may use [a] scholarship funds awarded under this section only to pay expenses associated with obtaining: 19 (1) Child Development Associate (CDA) national 20 21 credentials administered by the Council for Professional Recognition or a comparable nationally recognized entity that 22 23 credentials professionals in the early childhood education or child 24 development field;

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1	(2) <u>an</u> [ <del>Certified Child-Care Professional (CCP)</del>
2	credentials; or
3	[ <del>(3) a level one certificate or</del> ] associate's degree in
4	the <u>field</u> [ <del>area</del> ] of child development or early childhood education

10	(c) To be eligible to receive a scholarship [ <del>awarded</del> ] under
11	this section, a <u>child-care worker</u> [ <del>person</del> ] must:
12	(1) be employed <u>by</u> [ <del>in</del> ] a child-care facility <u>that has</u>
13	agreed to sponsor the child-care worker in accordance with
14	Subsection (d):
15	(A) for at least 30 hours each week; and
16	(B) at a pay rate that is less than \$15 per hour
17	[, as defined by Section 42.002, Human Resources Code];
18	(2) intend to obtain a credential[ <del>, certificate,</del> ] or
19	degree specified in Subsection (b);
20	(3) agree to work for <u>the sponsoring</u> [ <del>at least 18</del>
21	additional months in a] child-care facility for at least the length
22	of time prescribed by commission rule for purposes of this
23	<pre>subdivision; [, as defined by Section 42.002, Human Resources Code,</pre>
24	that accepts federal Child Care Development Fund subsidies and
25	that, at the time the person begins to fulfill the work requirement
26	imposed by this subdivision, is located:

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school campus considered low-performing under Subchapter Er 1 Chapter 39, Education Code; or 2 3 [(B) in an economically disadvantaged community, as determined by the commission; and] 4 5 agree to pay the percentage of the applicable (4) costs of books, credentialing fees, or tuition and fees associated 6 with obtaining a credential or degree specified in Subsection (b) 7 8 prescribed by commission rule for purposes of this subdivision; and 9 (5) satisfy any other requirements adopted by the commission. 10 A child-care facility that agrees to sponsor a 11 (d) 12 child-care worker under this section must: (1) provide th<u>e child-care worker with:</u> 13 14 (A) paid time off as prescribed by commission 15 rule; and 16 (B) any bonus or wage supplementation to which 17 the child-care worker is entitled under Subsection (e); and (2) pay the percentage of the applicable costs of 18 books, credentialing fees, or tuition and fees associated with 19 obtaining a credential or degree specified in Subsection (b) 20 prescribed by commission rule for purposes of this subdivision. [A 21 person may not receive more than one scholarship awarded under this 22 section.] 23 24 (e) A scholarship recipient who successfully obtains a credential or degree specified in Subsection (b) and satisfies any 25 26 other program requirement prescribed by this section or a rule adopted under this section is entitled to the [In addition, the 27

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commission may provide for] payment of a bonus or wage 1 supplementation [to a scholarship recipient who for 18 months after 2 the date of receiving the scholarship provides care for children 3 younger than six years of age while remaining in the employment of 4 5 the child-care facility that employed the person when the scholarship was awarded and that meets the requirements of 6 Subsection (c)(3)]. Any bonus or wage supplementation provided 7 8 under this subsection shall be paid by both the recipient's sponsoring child-care facility [in equal shares by the scholarship 9 recipient's employer] and the commission in shares prescribed by 10 commission rule. The commission shall determine the amount of any 11 bonus and the amount and duration of any wage supplementation 12 provided under this subsection. 13

(f) The commission shall fund scholarships and any bonuses or wage supplementation provided under this section through federal Child Care Development funds or other funding sources available to the commission. Total funding may not exceed <u>\$1</u> [<del>\$2</del>] million per state biennium.

(g) The commission shall adopt rules necessary to implementthis section. The rules must include provisions that:

(1) address the computation of the <u>length-of-service</u>
[<del>18-month service</del>] requirement prescribed <u>under</u> [<del>by</del>] Subsection
(c)(3) [<del>(c)</del>]; and

(2) ensure that the commission <u>has procedures for</u>
<u>recovering</u> [may recover] scholarship money from a recipient who
fails to comply with that <u>length-of-service</u> [service] requirement
or any other requirement imposed by the commission.

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1 SECTION 2. The Texas Workforce Commission shall adopt rules 2 for the administration of Section 302.006, Labor Code, as amended 3 by this Act, as soon as practicable following the effective date of 4 this Act, but not later than January 1, 2014.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
