## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the confidentiality of certain autopsy records.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 11, Article 49.25, Code of Criminal
- 5 Procedure, is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 11. RECORDS. (a) The medical examiner shall keep full
- 7 and complete records properly indexed, giving the name if known of
- 8 every person whose death is investigated, the place where the body
- 9 was found, the date, the cause and manner of death, and shall issue
- 10 a death certificate. The full report and detailed findings of the
- 11 autopsy, if any, shall be a part of the record. Copies of all
- 12 records shall promptly be delivered to the proper district, county,
- 13 or criminal district attorney in any case where further
- 14 investigation is advisable. The records are subject to required
- 15 public disclosure in accordance with Chapter 552, Government Code,
- 16 except that a photograph or x-ray of a body taken during an autopsy
- 17 is excepted from required public disclosure in accordance with
- 18 Chapter 552, Government Code, but is subject to disclosure:
- 19 (1) under a subpoena or authority of other law; or
- 20 (2) if the photograph or x-ray is of the body of a
- 21 person who died while in the custody of law enforcement.
- (b) Under the exception to public disclosure provided by
- 23 Subsection (a), a governmental body as defined by Section 552.003,
- 24 Government Code, may withhold a photograph or x-ray described by

- 1 Subsection (a) without requesting a decision from the attorney
- 2 general under Subchapter G, Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 3 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 4 a request for information that is received by a governmental body or
- 5 an officer for public information on or after the effective date of
- 6 this Act. A request for information that was received before the
- 7 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 8 date the request was received, and the former law is continued in
- 9 effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
